## **High Mileage Vehicles**

#### News from the Assessor's Office

Anyone with a high mileage vehicle on the October 1, 2019 Grand List in East Granby must present that vehicle to the



Assessor's Office for inspection from September 23rd through October 15th during regular office hours to determine if any adjustment in value is

allowed according to the NADA motor vehicle guide. Office hours are Monday through Thursday from 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM and 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM, and Friday 8:00 AM to 1:00 PM. The East Granby Assessor's Office will no longer make adjustments for vehicles with high mileage during July tax time.

## **Veterans Tax Exemptions**

You may be eligible for a real estate or motor vehicle tax exemption. There is no age restriction or length of residency requirement and there is no need to contact the Veterans Administration. You only need to be a resident who is an honorably discharged veteran, and whose time of service includes a specific period of war or conflict. You only need to contact the Assessor's Office to find out if you are eligible. And then, you only need to file your original discharge papers in the Town Clerk's Office.

Have you misplaced your original discharge papers? The above offices can tell you how to acquire a replacement original online. It's very easy. Have you tried before to get this exemption and were told that your time of service did not fall within the specific war or conflict dates? Please contact us again as these dates have been expanded in recent years.

Plus, if you have a VA disability rating of 10% or more, you are eligible for a higher exemption. The amount of the disability exemption has just been increased by the State for all eligible veterans. You need to bring your VA rating document to the Assessor if you have not done so. If the Assessor already has your VA rating document on file, your increased exemption will happen automatically.

Lastly, veterans, this exemption has been created by Connecticut State Statutes. It is earned by honorable military service during a time of war or conflict. Do not assume you are ineligible to receive it. Please contact the Assessor's Office at (860) 653-2852.



Saturday, November 16th

The Town of East Granby will provide a town wide leaf collection day on Saturday, November 16th. Leaves must be in brown kraft bags, which can be purchased at local hardware stores and need to be placed at the curbside prior to 7:00 AM on November 16th. Bags will not be picked up on private roads.

## East Granby Lions Rubber Duck Derby Results



A record crowd was on hand to witness a most exciting Rubber Duck Race on

September 8th at Granbrook Park. When the crew from Mark's Classic Cruise signaled that they were ready to release the ducks from atop the Greenway Bridge, the fans began counting down the seconds. On the final count, over 800 ducks were tossed into



Salmon Brook. After that long drop into the water, the ducks took a few seconds to get oriented and began to show the swimming skills they developed as a result of their strenuous training regimen. The race was on!

There were prizes for those who had adopted the first 11 ducks to enter the

winner's gate at the end of the racecourse. Duck #203 broke out of the pack early, pretty much led the whole way and won the \$500 First Place prize. Second Place went to Duck #814 who won \$250. Duck #346 took Third Place for \$100. Fourth Place went to #157 and won four tickets to the upcoming Lions Turkey Dinner. The other winning ducks each won \$25 restaurant gift certificates: The Fifth Place duck was #316; Sixth Place #650; Seventh Place #451; Eighth Place #357; Ninth Place #635; Tenth Place #685; and Eleventh Place went to #420.

adventures of East


Granby Pack 70. Scouts will be delivering donation bags and instructions to all East Granby neighborhoods on the morning of

## **East Granby Cemetery Association**

Fall is the perfect time to take a walk through the Center Cemetery and observe the beautiful foliage and colorful hydrangeas. Notice



the interesting and varied design of the very early headstones. In genera I, they fall into three different periods (and designs): Death's Heads (a conventional skull with or without wings); Winged Cherubs (where a face replaces the skull); and Wingless

Cherubs. By 1750 the Death's Head had been almost entirely replaced by the Winged Cherub. As the Puritans grew in prosperity, they were not quite so preoccupied with death. More beauty and less austerity were reflected in the stones, and the face represented looked less like a skull and more like a person. In the

Wingless Cherub period (last quarter of the 18th century), people seemed to want to get away from designs suggesting death, and there were even attempts to make the head into a portrait of the deceased! The Pagan Urn and Weeping Willow (in various forms and combinations) became popular in the early 1800s, and that is about all you will see after 1812. There are examples of all these types of early headstones in the Center Cemetery.

Work is ongoing to maintain, repair, and restore this important part of our town's history. Your support is greatly appreciated. 
#### **Historic Town Tours**


#### "Energetic Leadership 2019"

## Capitol Update

#### Rep. Tami Zawistowski, 61st District

Improving economic opportunities for Connecticut residents should be among our highest priorities in the General Assembly. A vital part of that is making our state more attractive for employers, thereby creating opportunities for job seekers of all ages and growing our tax base to reduce budgetary pressures. I am honored to report that I was recently awarded a 100% score by the Connecticut Business & Industry Association (CBIA) on key legislative issues from the 2019 session.

During the summer months while the legislature is not in session, I have continued to meet with employers across the region. Since last writing, I have met with some small area business owners, again toured the Amazon fulfilment center in Windsor which now employs over 1,800 workers (and will be hiring 200 more), and visited the HP Hood plant in Suffield which has 85 employees. Amazon in particular has been a benefit for Bradley International Airport and has offered new opportunities for our transportation and logistics industry. These visits have been truly informative, not just to learn about their businesses, but an opportunity hear their views directly on taxes, regulations, workforce development, utility costs, and challenges working with state agencies.

At the Capitol, the Appropriations Committee met for a public hearing on the Home Heating Assistance Block Grant. This program offers a lifeline to families and seniors to cannot afford to heat their homes. Important information such as program guidelines, benefit levels, and application dates will soon be available online at www.ct.gov/staywarm.

As the colder weather approaches, it is also a good time to have your home's energy efficiency checked for possible savings. Eversource offers a low-cost assessment service, called Home Energy Solutions. During the in-home visit, authorized contractors make on-the-spot energy improvements, such as:

- Sealing gaps and spaces around openings, between joists, etc.
- Installing energy-saving LED light bulbs
- Installing water-saving showerheads and faucet aerators
- Performing health and safety tests on heating equipment

At the end of the visit, the technicians will provide additional recommendations for energy-saving measures. Renters and homeowners also receive a report detailing the home's performance. There is a fee, generally under \$200, for the service. According to Energize CT, the average home in Connecticut receives about \$1,000 in services and realizes \$200-\$250 in savings on their annual energy bills. For more information or to sign up:

Do you know a college student interested in law, public administration or politics? The Connecticut General Assembly's Legislative Internship Program is now accepting applications. It's a hands-on program designed for interns to engage in the state's governmental processes, work directly with legislators, attend meetings and public hearings, and assist with administrative tasks. All undergraduate students enrolled in an accredited undergraduate degree program at a two- or four-year institution of higher education in the state can apply for the internship. Those already holding a bachelor's degree are not eligible. Connecticut residents attending out-of-state colleges are eligible to apply, but should contact us directly prior to application to the program. Minimum program qualifications include:

- Be 18 years of age or older by January program start
- Have competed 20 credits by January program start (no more than 3 AP credits can be counted towards this minimum)
- Possess a minimum 2.7 grade point average (at time of application)
- Be registered for a course (varies by institution) in order to receive credit for the internship

## Kinship & Respite Fund Grants Available to Help Guardians with School Expenses

Now that kids are back to school, Probate Judge David Baram reminds court-appointed guardians to apply for grants for school supplies. Probate Courts have been awarding grants from the state Kinship Fund and Respite Fund to court-appointed guardians for more than a decade. As of last October, eligibility for the grants was expanded beyond relatives serving as guardians to all those appointed by the Probate Courts who meet low-income guidelines.


A guardianship case typically arises in the Tobacco Valley Probate Court (Bloomfield, Windsor Locks, East Granby, Suffield) when parents are unable to care for their children due to mental illness, substance abuse, or incarceration. In most cases, Probate Courts appoint a grandparent or other relative to care for the children. In some cases, courts appoint a close family friend who has a longstanding relationship with the child. While foster parents receive funds from the state, court-appointed guardians do not; guardians who meet eligibility requirements can receive some assistance through the Kinship and Respite Fund grants.

"Grandparents, aunts and uncles, and neighbors who keep children in their familiar environments instead of going to foster care save the State tens of millions of dollars. In many cases, the guardians don't really have extra money to spend on a child's basic needs," said Judge David Baram. "Kinship and Respite Grants are there to help bridge the gap and make a huge difference to the households who apply for and receive them. I hope that court appointed guardians living in Bloomfield, Windsor Locks, East Granby, and Suffield will take advantage of this program."

The Kinship Fund assists guardians in paying for necessities such as school supplies, clothing, eyeglasses, school trips and sports fees. Often such expenses are paid directly to the providers. Kinship grants are capped at \$500 per child or \$2000 per family per year. The Respite Fund helps guardians with the cost of childcare, housing, transportation, and food. These grants are capped at \$2000 per year.

Guardians who meet income requirements can apply to both funds. Previous recipients must reapply to receive funds each year. Applications are posted at ctprobate.gov under the "Children's Matters" tab.








HALLOWEEN FIRE SAFETY TIPS

- >>> When choosing a costume, stay away from long trailing fabric. If your child is wearing a mask, make sure the eye holes are large enough so he or she can see out.
- **))) Provide children** with flashlights to carry for lighting or glow sticks as part of their costume.
- >>> Dried flowers, cornstalks and crepe paper catch fire easily. **Keep all decorations** away from open flames and other heat sources like light bulbs and heaters.
- **We a battery-operated** candle or glow-stick in jack-olanterns. If you use a real candle, use extreme caution. Make sure children are watched at all times when candles are lit. When lighting candles inside jack-olanterns, use long, fireplace-style matches or a utility lighter. Be sure to place lit pumpkins well away from anything that can burn and far enough out of the way of trick-or-treaters, doorsteps, walkways and yards.
- **))) Remember** to keep exits clear of decorations, so nothing blocks escape routes.
- >>> Make sure all smoke alarms in the home are working.

#### <u>Recalled Items from the U.S. Consumer</u> <u>Product Safety Commission</u>

Residents should be aware of a couple of products which were recently recalled by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission. The Consumer Product Safety Commission maintains a database of recalled products for consumers; their website is www.cpsc.gov and I encourage residents to visit the website occasionally to review any recalls. Below is not a complete list of recalls that have been issued since the last newsletter, the complete list is contained on their website. There is also information on a new app for mobile devices which allows for faster information from their website.

#### GreatCall Recalls Lively Mobile Plus Emergency Alert Device Due to risk of Call Button Failing in an Emergency

This recall involves Lively Plus model GCR4 emergency alert devices manufactured between January and April 2019. The recalled devices are silver and black and have "GreatCall" printed near the top of the front of the device. The model number is printed on the back and the date code 19.01 or 19.03 is printed on the bar code label of the device. The device is worn by consumers to call for emergency assistance. The recall is due to instances where the call button failed to operate in an emergency situation.

Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled device and contact GreatCall for information on a refund/replacement.

#### *Whirlpool Recalls Glass Cooktops with Touch Controls Due to Burn and Fire Hazards*

This recall involves cooktops with a glass cooking surface, touch controls, radiant and downdraft radiant models sold under Whirlpool, KitchenAid, and JennAir brands with several different model numbers. They were Manufactured from December 2016 through July 2019. The brand name is printed on the cooktop and the model number and serial numbers are printed on the underside of the cooktop. Please visit the website for the full list of models involved or call our office with your model number and we can assist you. The recall is due to issues with the cooktop elements turning on by themselves.

Consumers should immediately contact Whirlpool to arrange for a free installation of a replacement cooktop. When not in use, turn the unit off at the circuit breaker. Do not leave flammable materials or empty cookware on or near the cooktop.






