Memorial Day Parade ★ May 30th ★ 10:00 AM



Memorial Day is proclaimed to be a day to honor all Americans who died in military service. Please join our community in remembering those who sacrificed their lives to keep us safe and preserve our freedoms at our Annual Memorial Day Parade & Program. Big thanks to the East Granby Lions Club who sponsors the parade and the Connecticut Air National Guard who provides the Honor Guard & Flyover. Parade participants should assemble at 9:30 AM in front of the Elmwood Cemetery on Nicholson Road. The parade will begin at 10:00 AM, proceed down Nicholson Road, cross Route 20 to School Street, and cross Route 187 to the town campus where there will be a short memorial service. In case of rain, a ceremony will be held at the Senior/Community Center at 10:00 AM.

The 2022/2023 Town Budget Referendum was held on May 12th, after this edition of "Let's Talk Turkey" went to press. Please go to www.eastgranbyct.org for more information regarding the budget referendum.

Upcoming Town Meeting: There will be a Town Meeting called in late June to close fiscal year-end accounts and to review and act upon Board of Selectmen and Board of Education capital requests. These capital requests are not for additional funding, but rather to access capital funds previously approved by the Town through the annual budget referendum. Signs will be placed around town announcing the date.

Hazardous Waste Collection: East Granby provides household hazardous waste collection for residents throughout the Metropolitan District. Our day is October 15th in Windsor Locks; however, all residents can go to any collection spot and date listed on the MDC website from May 1st to October 30th: https://themdc.org/environment-health-safety/household-hazardous-waste-collection/.

Recycling Collection Center (RCC): Current RCC Permit stickers expire on June 30th. New stickers will become available to East Granby residents at the RCC facility located at 205 Turkey Hills Rd. (Route 20) beginning Saturday, July 2nd and can be purchased on any Tuesday or Saturday throughout the month of July. The annual cost is \$75 cash or \$80 check/credit card. In affiliation with paintcare.org we now offer a paint shed at the RCC where residents may drop off leftover paint/cans.

Thank you to our latest Eagle Scout candidate for choosing Granbrook Park as his Eagle Scout project. The pavilion was power washed and painted along with the playscape, the basketball court weeded, and the walking path cleaned and cleared. Stop by Granbrook Park and enjoy!

The payment drop box is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week and is located at the back door of the Town Hall facing the Police Department, Library, and Senior/Community Center. The payment box will be closed on the last day to pay, August 1st, at 4:00 PM. You still have an opportunity to mail your payment on or before August 1st. We accept United States Postmaster stamp/seal as on-time if postmarked by August 1st. Sorry, postage meters do not qualify as Postmaster stamp/seal.

June Is Dog Licensing Month!



All dogs aged six months and older must be licensed by June 30th. The cost is \$8.00 for dogs who are altered and \$19.00 for those who are not. A \$1.00 late fee per dog will be charged each month for those who are late, starting July 1st. All dogs must have proof of a current rabies vaccination on file.

There are three ways to license your dog:

- Online (additional \$1.75 processing fee) You'll need to know last year's tag number and rabies must be up to date. Visit eastgranbyct.org/Town Clerk/Dog License.
- Mail In Renewal Include rabies certificate if updating is needed.
- Drop Box Located outside Town Hall; include rabies certificate if updating is needed.

You may renew your dog license(s) online with your MasterCard, Visa, or Discover credit cards, debit card, or electronic check. There is a \$1.75 processing fee added to allow for this online service. This is a renewal service only and is not available for first-time registrations and kennel licenses. All dogs must have a current rabies vaccination on file. Simply go the eastgranbyct.org and click on "I Want To..." or click on the "Dog License" tab of the Town Clerk's web page.

When licensing by mail, please include a self-addressed envelope with 70 cents postage and mail it to: Town Clerk, P.O. Box TC, East Granby, CT 06026. No monies will be collected prior to June 1st.

Once we receive the information we will process and mail the license and dog tags back to you. Please note we cannot issue change so please leave the exact dollar amount when using the drop box or mailing in.

All reminder notices are being sent via e-mail only, as was done last year. If we have your e-mail on file, you will receive a reminder. Check your junk/spam mail. Failure to receive a reminder notice does not excuse the obligation of renewing your dog license per CGS 22-338. If you no longer own your dog, please notify us as we have no other way of knowing this. Questions? Please e-mail townclerk@egtownhall.com or call (860) 653-6528.

Operation Fuel: Operation Fuel offers emergency energy assistance to households who fall outside the Connecticut Energy



Assistance guidelines or have exhausted their Connecticut Energy Assistance grant. Applications can be completed through East Granby Social Services or directly through the Operation Fuel website at https://operationfuel.org/gethelp/.

Renter's Rebate: The Elderly/Totally Disabled Renters rebate program is open until October 1st for seniors aged 65 and over (or under 65 and on permanent long-term disability receiving Social Security benefits) that rented in 2021 and have a total income less than \$38,100 for a single person and less than \$46,400 per married couple. Renters' rebates can be up to \$900 for married couples and \$700 for single persons. The renters' rebate amount is based on a graduated income scale and the amount of rent and utility payments made in the previous calendar year. There is no asset restriction. Cannabis Community Workshop

Tuesday, May 24th • 7:00 PM Senior/Community Center

In June 2021, Public Act 21-1 was passed in Connecticut to allow cannabis establishments, such as dispensaries and production facilities, to operate in Connecticut. Legislators have been pondering the pros and cons of legalizing cannabis sales and production, with the primary pros being decriminalizing cannabis use and raising revenue. The State is in the early process of determining how they will collect and share revenue with towns.

Although there are several unknowns, the State legislation is written in such a way that it is forcing towns to decide their position on cannabis establishments operating in their towns now, prior to having any interest from an applicant, the application process worked out, or any understanding in how the revenue will be shared. Municipalities can choose to allow. prohibit the use, or take no action. According to State legislation, taking no action allows cannabis establishments as a permitted use as of right. Through zoning regulations, towns can designate certain areas of their town to consider separation distances from schools, etc., thus giving a town control of where dispensary or production facility uses can be located. Lastly, towns can choose to prohibit the use all together via their zoning regulations.

The East Granby Planning and Zoning Commission has scheduled a public Community Workshop at 7:00 PM on Tuesday, May 24th at the Senior/Community Center for the sole purpose of receiving comments and insight from the public on zoning for cannabis sales, manufacturing, warehousing, etc. The current proposal is to allow cannabis dispensaries and production facilities to locate in our Commerce Park B Zone (the industrial area located on Russell Road around the airport and the industrial area located off Floydville and Wolcott Roads). This zone was chosen to keep these uses away from the village center and residential areas. All residents are welcome to attend. For more information, please call (860) 653-3444.

News from Copper Hill United Methodist Church Rev. Dr. Kelvin Jones



As pastor at Copper Hill UMC for the past nine years, I am honored to write for "Let's Talk Turkey." I will be sharing news from our church and words of inspiration.

New opportunities have opened for Copper Hill Church as a result of adjusting to pandemic conditions. We began online ministry immediately. Now, even though we have been meeting in person for more than a year, online ministry continues to help us reach out to more participants. A few folks who worship online do so for convenience, while most choose online out of necessity because of illness or distance. Some are just learning about our church. We also have saved time with online meetings and have successfully conducted hybrid Bible studies as well. Overall, this new means of reaching people helps us to continue to do the work that God calls churches to do. We seek to be encouragers for those suffering discouragement, and to continue telling and putting into practice the good news about Jesus in ways that impact our 21st century society.

For example, on April 30th, our women at Copper Hill organized a tag sale to benefit Ukraine. Proceeds and donations totaled more than \$1500, which will be sent to United Methodist Committee on Relief. Some will be channeled to the UM church in Ukraine, and some will go to help refugees from the war. These donations are in addition to others already given to help in Ukraine.

Recently, our church was able to purchase the house next door to us. As the former Copper Hill Schoolhouse, it is an historical building, as is our sanctuary. The history records show that our church study groups occasionally met in the schoolhouse many years ago. It was later converted into a residence. Next month,

on June 12th after morning service, our congregation plans to gather on the lawn of the house for a prayer of dedication.

Each time I write, I plan to share a verse of inspiration. Today's verse is: "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom" (Proverbs 10:9). It reminds us that reverence for God provides the wisest foundation for a healthy perspective on life.

Spotlight on Small Businesses

News from the Economic Development Commission

Periodically, the East Granby Economic Development Commission highlights businesses in town so that residents can know about some of the "hidden gems" that are located here. In this month and in future editions, our focus will be on some of the small businesses in town.

Anchor Eye Center: Bridget Bortz, Doctor of Optometry, will open a full-service eye care business at the East Street Shops (Planet Fitness Plaza) in mid to late May. Doctor Bortz and her family are residents of East Granby and her husband Ricky, a Navy veteran, serves on the Board of Education. Bridget graduated from the New England College of Optometry and did her residency at a VA Hospital.

Anchor Eye Center will offer full-service eye care including lens prescriptions and pressure measurement as well as ocular disease diagnosis, such as glaucoma and macular degeneration. In addition, they will have an optical shop with a full-time optician providing, lenses, frames and contact lenses. Look for their grand opening later this month.

About the Economic Development Commission: The EDC serves as an advisory board to the Planning & Zoning Commission. The Economic Development Commission reviews conceptual and pending land use applications, and through Town staff makes advisory comments to the other boards and commissions. The Economic Development Commission's primary function is to develop policies that support business growth, development, retention, and expansion. As a Commission the three primary goals are to increase revenue for the Town to help reduce the property tax burden, create good paying jobs, and provide needed services to the local businesses and residents of East Granby.

Cannabis Community Workshop on May 24th: The East Granby Planning & Zoning Commission will hold a Community Workshop on Tuesday, May 24th at 7:00 PM at the East Granby Senior/Community Center to receive comments and insight from the public on zoning for cannabis sales, manufacturing, warehousing, etc. There will be no other items for discussion and no minutes will be taken as this is not a Commission meeting.

Jim and Dave both kept the interests of the town residents as their primary focus. DTC Chairman Mike Malloy said, "There is not much you can't achieve with hard work and compassion, and Jim Hayden proved that."

At the state level, Governor Lamont has delivered record tax relief, reduced gas prices to the lowest in the northeast, and delivered record budget surpluses. Ned has things looking up for Connecticut!

East Granby Republicans

It has only been four months since our Republican team has been fully sworn into their boards and commissions, and they are already hard at work. With guidance and leadership from your Republican team and collaboration from all other board members, we expect our mill rate to increase by a mere 0.5, or 1.5% for the next fiscal year. Despite the tremendous learning



curve for our new First Selectwoman Eden Wimpfheimer, she has presented a responsible budget for the coming fiscal year. The Board of Education also presented a reasonable budget. While the BOE budget

exceeded the Board of Finance guidance, their budget includes the addition of women's volleyball in the high school and middle school intramural sports. These budgets show our adherence to two of our stated goals: managing your tax dollars responsibly and promoting additional programs for our students. The total expected property tax increase of only 1.5% is an incredible accomplishment, seeing that consumer prices have increased by more than 8%, gasoline prices are up over 60%, and home heating oil has doubled in price.

With reference to another of our goals to increase transparency, our Board of Selectmen vows to bring all budgets to referendum instead of just town meetings. Town meetings seldom draw more than 40-50 participants, but referendums show voter participation rates of 15-30% (500 to 1000). We encourage all eligible voters to express their wishes at the polling booth and would be delighted to see participation rates far greater.

With respect to our stated goal of sensible business growth, our Planning & Zoning team is working with a well-respected and well-financed developer to bring responsible growth to our town. We have kept their interest in our town and are in the process of reviewing future building plans. Additional growth will increase our Grand List, bring additional revenue to our town, which will keep our taxes lower.

Ever since taking office, we have provided an "open door" policy, and will continue to do so for the entire duration of our terms in office. We have many more ideas and welcome any thoughts or suggestions you may have.

Capitol Update Rep. Tami Zawistowski, 61st District

As I write this at the beginning of May, the Legislative Session is entering its final days before concluding at midnight on May 4th. The General

Assembly has acted on several important issues, while budget and tax relief negotiations are ongoing. With rising inflation and a heavy tax burden, my focus this session has been on affordability. In early March, House and Senate Republicans called for the suspension



of the State's gross receipts tax on gasoline. This hidden tax applies to wholesale petroleum, often driving higher price spikes than neighboring states. We reached a compromise with Governor Lamont and Democrats to suspend the 25 cent per gallon gas tax through June 30th and provide free bus fares.

During this year's budget negotiations, Republicans offered a \$1.2 billion tax relief plan, including a reduction in the income tax for lower tax brackets, continuation of gas tax relief and adding diesel, a sales tax reduction, and repeal of the Highway Use Tax (HUT). I voted against the HUT last year which is scheduled to take effect next January. Reforms implemented in the 2017 bipartisan budget have greatly improved our state's financial situation, creating a record rainy day fund and contributions toward long-term debt. Inflation and strong revenue collections in have led to a huge windfall of tax dollars this year—it's imperative that we return some of this money to taxpayers. At the time of writing, a final budget package has not yet been released, and it is expected that there will be some measure of tax relief.

A major focus of at the Capitol this year was addressing the growing youth mental health crisis. The past two years of pandemic and restrictions have exacerbated and exposed gaps in our state's mental and behavioral health systems. The House of Representatives passed HB 5001 "An Act Concerning Children's Mental Health," a wide-ranging proposal that would provide incentives to grow the behavioral health workforce, expand treatment facilities, and increase insurance coverage for mental health services. Additionally, the legislation will establish a 9-8-8 suicide prevention and mental health crisis lifeline.

The legislature has also continued its commitment to combating the ongoing opioid crisis. I supported HB 5430 "An Act Concerning Opioids," a bill that provides for mobile treatment facilities and allows wider use of fentanyl test strips. Republicans offered an amendment that received bipartisan approval to implement a pilot peer navigator program in five communities across the state. This innovative treatment model will set up two-person teams to increase engagement between healthcare, social services, and treatment providers and persons with opioid use disorder.

Another bill of interest is SB 187 "An Act Concerning Cottage Food Operations." Cottage foods are defined as prepared food products that are perceived as lower risk and can be produced in a home environment without the regulations that apply to restaurants or grocery stores. This bill increases the maximum gross income allowed for these small food producers from \$25,000 to \$50,000 per year. Recycling Collection Center (RCC) 205 Turkey Hill Road JULY 1, 2022 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2023 Tuesdays and Saturdays from 7am-3pm

Administrative Rules Effective July 1, 2022

The following rules and regulations are in effect at the RCC. This is not meant to be a comprehensive list, but rather highlights of the overall policy. For clarifications on any of these items, please contact the First Selectman's office at (860) 413-3301.

- 1. **Effective, July 1, 2022, a \$75 new/renewal permit fee or Credit/Debit Card in the amount of \$80.00** will be charged per household for residents to have access to the transfer station to dispose of municipal solid waste. 2022/2023 permits expire on June 30, 2023. You will have the month of July to obtain a permit. New permits are only issued at the RCC. After July 30, 2022, no one will be allowed to use the facility without a new permit. Stickers are limited to two per household. **Only one truck or trailer load allowed per day.**
- 2. Transfer station access is limited to residents of East Granby. Only residential building materials will be accepted. Contractors are not permitted to dispose of commercial building materials.
- 3. New permits may be purchased at the RCC by producing a valid driver's license, the vehicle registration, showing the vehicle registered in East Granby, and a **check or money order payable to the Town of East Granby in the amount of \$75.00 or Credit/Debit Card in the amount of \$80.00**. Credit/Debit Cards will have a \$5.00 Surcharge. We do not accept cash. Subsequent to the permit being processed, the stickers will be administered at the RCC, and affixed by the Attendant to the bottom driver's side corner of the windshield.
- 4. No permits shall be required for the disposal of recyclable materials including commingles such as bottles and glass, cardboard, e-waste, metals oil, electronics, household batteries, fluorescent light bulbs, and textiles such as clothing and bedding.
- 5. Valid Permits will allow disposal of the following at the RCC:
 - ✓ Household waste
 - ✓ Bulky Waste
 - ✓ Leaf & grass clippings
 - ✓ Brush
 - ✓ Restricted quantities of building materials that homeowners have used to repair their homes. Limit one load or trailer load per day.
- 6. The following items are **not** accepted at the RCC:
 - ✓ Tires
 - ✓ Hazardous Waste (i.e. pathological, biological, cesspool or other human wastes which according to federal, state, or local rules or regulations from time to time re4quire special handling in their collection, treatment, or disposal under 42 U.S.C. Section 6921-6925 EPA)
 - ✓ Antifreeze
 - ✓ Gasoline
 - ✓ Car Batteries
- 7. Any items that contain Freon will require a check made out to the Town of East Granby in the amount of \$25.00 or \$30.00 if paying by Credit/Debit Card for each item to cover the town's disposal fee.

Administrative Rules Continued... Effective July 1, 2022

Current RCC permit stickers expire on June 30, 2022. New stickers will become available at the RCC facility beginning Saturday July 3, 2022, and can be purchased on any Tuesday or Saturday throughout the month.

No resident will be allowed to dispose of their refuse after July 30th without purchasing a new permit. Permit purchases will be available at the RCC on any day which the RCC is open.

Each resident purchasing a permit will need to produce a current driver's license, and vehicle registration showing an East Granby address, and payment of a check or money order in the amount of \$75.00 made out to the TOWN OF EAST GRANBY or \$80.00 if paying by Credit/Debit Card to the attendant. **CASH is not accepted**.

PLEASE NOTE THAT STICKERS ARE <u>NOT PRO-RATED</u>. THE PRICE IS \$75.00 IF PAYING BY CHECK OR MONEY ORDER, OR \$80.00 IF PAYING BY CREDIT/DEBIT CARD. WHETHER YOU PURCHASE THE PERMIT IN JULY OR APRIL. CREDIT/DEBIT CARDS WILL HAVE A \$5.00 SURCHARGE.

After producing the required information, the attendant will complete a form with the provided information. The attendant will then remove the old permit and affix a new sticker to the bottom, passenger side corner of the windshield. The sticker may not be removed from the windshield thereafter, as it will destruct while being removed.

Each household is allowed two permits for the \$75.00 (check/Money Order) or \$80.00 (Credit/Debit Card) fee. The Attendant will have record of the initial payment and will issue a second permit at no additional charge. The resident must produce their driver's license, current registration, and be driving the vehicle the second sticker will be affixed to.

If during the fiscal year, the resident purchases a different vehicle, or replaces their windshield, the attendant will cancel the old permit and issue a new one.

If a resident is borrowing a vehicle, they may obtain a temporary, one-day pass, provided the \$75.00 check/money order or \$80.00 credit/debit card permit fee has been paid, this can be obtained at the RCC. At that time, the resident's current driver's license and the license plate number of the vehicle being borrowed must be provided.



After the long cold winter, grilling season is upon us and with that comes associated fire and safety hazards. Please see the attached safety sheet from the National Fire Protection Association to help keep everyone safe this season.

Recalled Items from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission

Residents should be aware of a couple of products which were recently recalled by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission. The Consumer Product Safety Commission maintains a database of recalled products for consumers. Their website www.cpsc.gov and I encourage residents to occasionally visit the website to review any recalls. Below is not a complete list of recalls that have been issued since the last newsletter: the complete list is contained on their website. There is also information on a new app for mobile devices which allows for faster information from their website.

Best Buy Recalls InsigniaTM Air Fryers and Air Fryer Ovens Due to Fire and Burn Hazards

This recall involves the Insignia Digital Air Fryers, Insignia Analog Air Fryers, and Insignia Digital Air Fryer Ovens, model numbers NS-AF32DBK9, NS-AF32MBK9, NS-AF50MBK9, NS-AF53DSS0, NS-AF53MSS0, NS-AF55DBK9, NS-AF06DBK1 and NS-AF06DSS1 sold by Best Buy. The brand name INSIGNIA is on the top or front of each unit. A rating label on the underside of each unit identifies the brand INSIGNIA and the model number. The air fryers and air fryer ovens have cooking chamber capacities ranging from approximately 3.4 to 10 quarts, and plastic or plastic and stainless-steel bodies in black and stainless-steel finishes.

There have been several reports of these air fryers catching fire, burning, and melting. Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled air fryers and air fryer ovens and register online at www.insigniaairfryerrecall.expertinquiry.com or call Best Buy at 800-566-7498 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. ET Monday through Friday to arrange a return through a pre-paid shipping box and label and return instructions.

The consumer will receive a refund in the form of a credit for use at Best Buy stores or Bestbuy.com. Consumers will receive a credit of \$50 or the amount on the purchase receipt if higher. Consumers do not need a purchase receipt to get the \$50 credit.

Generac Power Systems Recalls Generac and DR Power Electric Start Pressure Washers Due to Carbon Monoxide Hazard

This recall involves Generac and DR Power brand electric start pressure washers with model numbers DPW3100DEN, DPW3101DEN, DPW3102DEN, G0071320, G0071321, G0071430 and G0071431. The electric start pressure washers have an electric start/stop button for the unit's gasoline-powered engines, as well as a rechargeable battery used to power the button. The model and serial numbers are printed on a label located on the product's frame. Consumers can check specific unit type, model number and serial number location www.generac.com/serviceinformation at support/product-support-lookup. There have been several instances of the start/stop button malfunctioning and starting the unit posing a carbon monoxide risk.

Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled pressure washer unless they have removed the rechargeable battery, and contact Generac to arrange to have an authorized dealer replace the start/stop switch on the pressure washer free of charge. The pressure washer can continue to be used with the battery removed but using the pull-start option to start the unit. Generac is contacting known consumers directly to provide more details about the repair. Each class day consists of a circuitry lesson and a hands-on electronics project, using components like lights, buzzers, switches, motors, and sensors. Circuit Lab staff will make sure participants create a project that they can be proud of each day. Most class days include a take-home project.

Scratch Programming (8/15 - 8/19) | 1:00 - 4:00 pm | Grades 3 - 5

Let's write some code! In this class, we will use the Scratch programming language to build interactive animations, games, and more. Scratch has a user-friendly interface that provides the most fun and intuitive way to design and build custom computer programs. Through their projects in this class, participants will also develop logical thinking skills and an understanding of how computers work. No previous programming experience is necessary. At the end of the class, participants can keep copies of their programs to take home.

Cross Country Training Program (Grades 6 - 12)

Tuesdays and Thursdays | June 28 - September 2 | 5:30 - 7:00 PM | Cost: \$130

It can be tough to motivate yourself to follow an offseason training schedule during the lazy days of summer. This program will help bridge the gap between the end of the school year and the start of their upcoming season in a more structured and formalized manner. This ten-week program utilizes off-season training plans either provided by each participant's own coach, or

the off-season training program provided by the Total Runner which will focus on speedwork, interval training, and mileage building. The program offers two group runs each week that will focus on running fundamentals and individual needs. Participation in group sessions is not required, and runs can be done independently.

East Granby Youth Service Bureau

The mission of the East Granby Youth Service Bureau is to coordinate the delivery of community-based services for prevention, intervention, treatment, and follow up for at risk youth, and to provide opportunities for all youth to function as responsible members of the community.

Commission on Youth Services

The commission on Youth Services (CYS) has been established to serve in an advisory capacity and support the mission and staff of the Youth Services Bureau. Members are appointed by the board of selectman and represent various segments of the community including law enforcement, education, children and families, and local business and organization. The goal of the CYS is to advocate for our youth population by evaluating priority needs and interests on an ongoing basis and assisting the YSB in the development of appropriate programs and services. Meetings are held every third Monday of the month and are open to the public.

Counseling Services

Counseling services addressing emotional, behavioral, and mental health issues are available for children and families residing in East Granby. We provide parenting support, family therapy, individual therapy, play therapy for children, and school consultation. School, parent, and self referrals are accepted. All services are professional and confidential and are offered free of charge to East Granby residents.

We can address a range of issues including:

- Common developmental issues
- School behavior and/or peer relationship issues
- Family conflicts
- Suicide ideation
- Depression

- Anger management
- Eating disorders
- Substance abuse
- Self-mutilation

Youth and Family Therapy Services Available

The end of summer is a busy time, and we hope you enjoy every last bit of sun and fun before the new school year starts. For many children, the transition back to school may bring a greater magnitude of change than ever before. Whether students are transitioning from remote learning back to in-person instruction, or from small hybrid classes to full classrooms, these adjustments can create significant anxiety for kids of all ages. Should you find your children or family in need of some additional support during the school year, please remember that the Youth Service Bureau offers free counseling services to East Granby youth and their families. All counseling services are confidential and are provided by a licensed therapist or professionally supervised intern. School, parent and self-referrals are all welcome. Youth Action Council

The middle school youth action council has had a great year and is looking forward to celebrating at the end! However, we still are working on organizing a try it night for new members and a sports day for elementary age children with the high school youth action council. Some members are getting certified in babysitting so we can provide better babysitting services as well! Activities that we had planned in the past couple of months was a movie night for elementary students and we helped the Easter Bunny hide eggs for the town-wide easter egg hunt! Lastly, we worked with the high school YAC and the Youth Service Bureau to provide education to the middle school regarding the dangers of vaping.

East Granby High School Youth Action Council has been busy this Spring! A family fun Earth Day Scavenger Hunt on the East Granby Land Trust's Ian Clark Preserve Trail was a success! The weather was perfect for families to get

outside, learn about nature, and create some fairy houses. The Kindness Rocks and Fairy Houses are still there if you would like to explore and add your own. Coming soon is a Sports Day for young East Granby residents, hosted by both Middle and High School YAC. EGHS YAC is also focused on youth prevention projects to close out the year of service. Are you a high school student invested in community service with a desire to develop your leadership skills? Applications for next year's EGHS YAC will be available soon!

Youth Services

Over the last couple of months Youth Services has been excited to run some familiar and new programs! For our family/parents we had the pleasure of running our Parenting the Love and Logic Way program. This program went well, and we hope to run a session at the beginning of the school year. For our elementary school aged kids, our Girls Circle group for young girls ran at R.D. Seymour elementary. The Girls had a blast and were able to make some great connections. We hope to get a Middle school Girls Circle going real soon.

Youth Services is ecstatic to announce our programming with Love On A Leash! On March 16, 2022, we were able to host the first-ever Dog therapy at East Granby High school. It was an absolute hit with the students, and we have been going back once a month. During lunch, students had the opportunity to pet, play, or just hang out with multiple dogs. We have had the pleasure of coming into the High school three times this year and once in the Middle School. By the end of the school year, we hope to bring in Love on a leash's reading to a dog program in elementary schools. In addition to these programs, Youth Services has been hard at work with the Middle School and High School Youth Action Council to bring Vaping Awareness and prevention into the schools. Juvenile Review Board

A Juvenile Review Board (JRB) has been established to provide a community-based program for diverting eligible juvenile cases from the Juvenile Justice System, and to provide intervention at the local level. The JRB is comprised of 11 members appointed by the Board of Selectmen representing key areas of our community, including law enforcement, school officials, court personnel, and local community members. The goal of the JRB is to make effective recommendations to assist the juvenile in avoiding repeat behaviors leading to an arrest or a school-based referral to the Juvenile Justice System.

Career Learning Across EGPS

From Carl Allgrove to R.D. Seymour, and from East Granby Middle to the High school, our students learn about various careers across the school year. Our youngest learners begin career exploration in our Pre-K program, mostly through dramatic play. Students dress up and play restaurant, airplane pilot, and train engineer. Soon they will have a flower shop where they will have a cashier. Each fall, Fire Marshal Ken Beliveau, along with another firefighter, visit the preschool program wearing their full gear to teach them about fire safety. Another way of learning through play is an activity called "How Do You Know?" The teacher will put props on the display board, such as a pitchfork or a stethoscope, and the students have to identify which job the character has by using the job-related clues. One of the main ways they learn about jobs is through literature and the wide variety of career-based books they read together.

For kindergarten students, the teachers follow the Connecticut Social Studies Frameworks, which states for that grade level, "With the Social Studies Standard: Me and My Community: Home, Class, School, and Town communities are studied (ex. class and school rules, maps of neighborhoods and town)". Our kindergarten students go on an annual field trip to the nearby fire station as well as the East Granby Post Office. In years past, the students drew a fire escape route for their own house and shared it with the firefighters. At the post office, students each buy a stamp and mail a surprise envelope to their home and tour the facility to see how mail is processed. Like the preschool program, literature about jobs is a major component of student learning. The exploration of careers continues as students move up in the lower elementary grades with first grade exploring community helper careers as well as the beginning of economics studies in exploring goods versus services.

For the fifth grade students, STEM content and careers were the focal points for the week-long STARBASE program in Windsor Locks. Teachers Shannon Karlowicz and Amanda Striefler shared about the program at the East Granby Board of Education meeting on March 28, 2022. Their students had the opportunity to attend in February and teachers Joe Esposito and Shannon Lavariere took their fifth grade classes in April. The students were able to tour the Army Aviation Support as part of the career exploration. While at STARBASE, students had an opportunity to use Creo engineering software, build an Egbert pod to protect an egg, and other fun hands-on activities. The occupational learning at R.D. Seymour school is not confined to only fifth grade; our students learn about mathematicians, scientists, writers and more across all grade levels.

Participating students in the STARBASE program shared their excitement about the experience with Sydney Bloom saying, "Starbase opened my eyes to careers in the fields of S.T.E.M. by showing me fun ways that the different aspects of S.T.E.M. can be applied to different kinds of careers." Teacher Joe Esposito said it was a "wonderful experience where the students were asked to work collaboratively to solve problems and learn new skills. This made the more challenging skills we were working with more accessible to everyone. One of my students even said, 'This is it. I found where I want to work when I grow up', as we were walking through the facilities."

At East Granby Middle School, not only do students explore careers in their core subjects and electives, but they can participate in Invention Convention, the afterschool club run by Dr. Sarah Faulkner. This year, we have Invention Convention participants advancing to Nationals. Genevieve Corricelli and Varshny Sriganesh will be traveling to The Henry Ford Museum in Dearborn, Michigan from June 1-June 3. Genevieve Corricelli was selected for her invention of *ReBrace*, a long-lasting protector that

attaches to braces on teeth to protect your mouth from abrasion by the braces. Varshny Sriganesh was chosen for her invention of *Firen*, an app that vibrates and awakens people with hearing loss during a fire alarm. Both students will be presenting their invention at a Board of Education meeting in May which can be viewed live on www.gctv.org "Shows in the Spotlight."

In a full circle moment, Erin Russell presented her senior Capstone project to the East Granby Board of Education at their April 25, 2022 meeting regarding her work at the national level with the Invention Convention program through the Henry Ford Museum of American Innovation. As an eighth grade student, Erin was an Invention Convention participant and was invited to the national level competition. For her senior Capstone project, she worked on communications and recruitment for the national organization. One of the highlights was her involvement in the InventED Twitter chat with the head of the organization and participants around the world.

The Capstone Experience is a requirement for high school graduation and has students exploring careers, creating community service projects, and volunteering. Some of the careers students presented were landscaping, construction, firefighting, architecture, physician assistants, automotive repair, piloting, education, nursing, the Armed Forces, opticians, and veterinary technicians. One of our students, Mikayla, presented about welding careers and her training at Asnuntuck Community College through EGHS's partnership with ACC. Mikayla will be attending a welding program in Wyoming upon graduation.

Recently, twenty East Granby High School students traveled to Asnuntuck Community College to learn more about their partnership offerings through East Granby. Students toured the facility with Assistant Principal Patrick Gustafson, School Counselor Tara DiSorbo, and teacher Liddy Doyle. They were able to visit several work areas/shops including manufacturing, advanced manufacturing, machine technology, and welding. Mr. Gustafson shared, "The instructor that gave us a tour discussed the degree programs and how many jobs were available and what the starting pay was for each."

As students move through the East Granby Public School district, they learn about careers across all disciplines, from studying architectural and culinary professions, to engineering and entrepreneurship. We are fortunate that the children of East Granby have such a breadth and depth of opportunities as they advance through the district. Once in high school, they further explore possibilities for their future. 
