#### FY 2022/2023 Approved Operating Budget:

East Granby taxpayers voted and approved the annual budget on May 12th with 285 in favor and 148 opposed. A total of 12% of the eligible voters voted. Following the vote, the Board of Finance (BOF) set the mill rate at 34.1 mills.



#### **Veterans Tax Exemptions**

There are tax exemptions possible on real estate or motor vehicles for honorably discharged veterans of all ages and branches of service. Their time of service needs to include a specific period of war or conflict, regardless of whether they served in combat or not. Discharge papers need to be filed in the Town Hall. Additionally, a VA disability rating of 10% or more warrants a higher exemption. The rating document from the VA also needs to be filed. There is also a motor vehicle exemption for persons in active service in all branches. No veteran or person in active service should assume that he/she is not eligible. Call the Assessor's Office at (860) 653-2852 to learn more.

#### **Board of Assessment Appeals**

The Board of Assessment Appeals will meet in open session at the East Granby Town Hall on Monday, September 19th from 6:00 to 8:00 PM for the sole purpose of hearing appeals related to the assessment of motor vehicles listed on the October 2021 Grand List. No appointments are needed. Vehicles in question should be driven to the Town Hall parking lot. Please note that the assessment date for these vehicles was October 1, 2021 and that the State of Connecticut requires that assessments used are according to the values and guidelines set forth in the October 2021 J.D. ### East Granby Lions Rubber Duck Derby

Sunday, September 11th



It is the most exciting spectator sport in East Granby! It is like the World Cup of Duck Racing! The 10th Annual East Granby Lions Rubber Duck Derby is coming to town! This year's

rubber ducks have been training all year and only the best have passed the exhaustive screening and qualification process and are ready to race in this year's Derby. Their extensive training schedule ensures they will be in top physical and mental condition for our Duck Race.



Imagine a thousand rubber ducks racing down Salmon Brook towards the finish line with hundreds of people alongside the riverbank cheering on their adopted duck, hoping it will finish in the money. To participate, adopt a duck (purchase a ticket). Ducks are \$5 each. Each ticket has a number corresponding to the numbers printed on each duck. At 1:30 PM on September 11th, they will be ceremoniously released from the Greenway bike bridge over Salmon Brook. They will float to the finish line at Granbrook Park. Prizes include \$500, \$250, and \$100 preloaded Visa Cards and more.

Pre-race festivities at Granbrook Park (off Route 189/Hartford Avenue near the East Granby/Granby border) begin at 11:00 AM. There will be burgers, hot dogs, and other refreshments, as well as games for kids. It's fun for the whole family. The Rubber Duck Derby is the major fundraiser for the East Granby Lions Club and 100% of all money raised goes towards providing scholarships and contributing to local organizations and charities.

Ducks can be adopted at the East Granby Library or at the Town Clerk's Office at Town Hall. You may also see them at the RCC (a.k.a. The Dump) or at local supermarkets on a few Saturday mornings. Ducks are also sold by all Lion members and can be purchased on the day of the race. #### **Emergency Assistance Fund**

The East Granby Emergency Assistance Fund is available to those income eligible residents who are in need of emergency



financial assistance with fuel, housing, medical, electric, and other critical needs. The fund is supported solely through donations and gifts from the community and 100% of the funds raised are given back to qualifying residents who are facing

#### **Energy Assistance**

Applications will be taken after October 1st from residents of East Granby who wish to apply for the Connecticut Energy Assistance



Program. This program is designed to help offset the winter heating costs of Connecticut's lower income households. Winter heating assistance helps pay for a

household's primary heating source such as oil, natural gas, electricity, propane, kerosene, coal, wood, and wood pellets.

#### Renter's Rebate

The Elderly/Totally Disabled Renters Rebate Program is open until October 1st for seniors age 65 and over (or under 65 and on



permanent long term disability receiving Social Security benefits) that rented in 2021 and have a total income less than \$38,100 for a single person and less than \$46,400 per married couple. Renters' Rebates can be up to \$900 for married couples and \$700 for single persons. The Renters' Rebate amount

is based on a graduated income scale and the amount of rent and utility payments made in the previous calendar year. There is no asset restriction. Please call Social Services for more information or to apply.



As a Commission the three primary goals are to increase revenue for the Town to help reduce the property tax burden, create good paying jobs, and provide needed services to the local businesses and residents of East Granby.

#### Village Center Master Concept Plan

"If you don't know where you are going, you'll end up someplace else." — Yogi Berra

The Town of East Granby's Economic Development Commission (EDC) along with our Planning and Zoning (P&Z) Commission and Board of Selectmen (BOS) have taken Yogi's advice to heart. As recommended by our Plan of Conservation and Development, we are embarking on a journey to create a Village Center Master Concept Plan. A key goal of this plan among other details is to make the Village Center District a pedestrian friendly and inviting destination. As stated in the plan description, "The Village Center District shall be designed, developed, and used as a destination. People must be given a reason to be there. Walkable Main Street, walkability (and bike-ability) of the Village Center is to be emphasized in designs."

Over the coming months you will hear more about this project. In fact, we hope you will join us in workshops to help define how our Village Center and Transition zones are developed. The completed plan will be used to provide guidance for new development, as well as updates to existing properties. August will be a busy month for this project. Early in the month we are issuing a Request for Proposal (RFP) and expect to receive

consultant quotes by month's end. Once a consultant is selected, they will work with our residents and Town officials to create a plan that supports development of our Town Village Center and Transition zones into a cohesive destination for us all to enjoy. Stay tuned for your opportunity to participate.

In 2017 the State Legislature passed a law requiring all towns create a plan to address affordable housing in their municipality. These plans were due on June 1, 2022. The Town, through its new consulting Planner, has drafted an Affordable Housing Plan that makes recommendations for multiple boards and commissions to consider ways to promote not only affordable housing but housing diversity. Once the plan is adopted by the Board of Selectmen, the Town will move forward to implement any recommendations that they feel are appropriate for the Town of East Granby. This plan is only advisory in nature and the Town has no obligation to implement any of the recommendations. The Town will look to educate the public regarding affordable housing and housing diversity through a webpage and public outreach sessions.

One of the goals of your East Granby Republican team is to increase transparency in our town. One area for consideration is the policies of the Board of Education. There are hundreds and hundreds of pages in the Board of Education policy guidelines. These policies should be more concise. We are working to create the ability to do word searches. This will enable the parents of our school children to review what is best for them, and to determine if our school system is adhering to them.

This year is an election year, and our own Tami Zawistowski is up for re-election in the 61st District. #### Capitol Update Rep. Tami Zawistowski, 61st District

Since the last issue of "Let's Talk Turkey," the legislative session concluded in early May. After the end of each session, the Office of Legislative

Research compiles non-partisan reports for the general public on major legislation and topical reports that dive deeper into certain categories. These reports include the wide-ranging "Major Acts for 2022" report, and over a dozen focused "Acts Affecting" reports on topics such as seniors, businesses, veterans, utilities, and more. These reports are all available at the General Assembly website at www.cga.ct.gov/OLR.

Concerns about inflation and fluctuating energy prices have continued to grow since the close of the legislative session. During this time, the House and Senate Republican Caucuses continued to call for substantive relief to directly benefit residents. In June, we held rallies across the state to bring attention to our Affordable Connecticut plan. Proposed relief included income tax reduction from 5% to 4% for working- and middle-class families, sales tax reduction to 5.99%, extending the gas tax holiday to diesel, and additional funding for energy assistance programs among other changes. This relief could be offered while maintaining a full rainy-day fund and making historically large payments on long-term debt. As a new fiscal year started in July, it became clear that state revenues have profited immensely from inflation—as residents pay more for goods, the taxes collected on those goods increases, bringing the surplus to over \$4 billion dollars. I will continue to advocate for an end to this overtaxation—it's your money.

Locally, many of our small businesses are impacted by steeply increasing costs, such as the doubling of fertilizer prices to our farms and considerably higher wholesale food prices for our restaurants, bakery, and privately owned convenience stores, in addition to the increased fuel prices that have affected us all. Please consider buying from and supporting the local farms and businesses that help make our community a more welcoming and vibrant place to live.

The Connecticut Business and Industry Association recently released their scorecard for the 2022 session measuring support for small businesses, workforce development, and regulatory reform. I'm proud to be among the legislators who earned a 100% score. Scored legislation included support for occupational licensing reform and apprenticeship programs, as well as opposition to burdensome anti-employer regulations. #### **SAFETY TIPS**

- Look for fully sprinklered housing when choosing a dorm or off-campus housing.
- Make sure you can hear the building alarm system when you are in your dorm room.
- If you live in a dormitory, make sure your sleeping room has a smoke alarm, or your dormitory suite has a smoke alarm in each living area as well as the sleeping room. For the best protection, all smoke alarms in the dormitory suite should be interconnected so that when one sounds, they all sound.
- If you live in an apartment or house, make sure smoke alarms are installed in each sleeping room, outside every sleeping area, and on each level of the apartment unit or house. For the best protection, all smoke alarms in the apartment unit or house should be interconnected so that when one sounds, they all sound.
- Test all smoke alarms at least monthly.
- Never remove batteries or disable the alarm.
- Learn your building's evacuation plan and practice all drills as if they were the real thing.
- If you live off campus, have a fire escape plan with two ways out of every room.
- When the smoke alarm or fire alarm sounds, get out of the building quickly and stay out.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking.
- Cook only when you are alert, not sleepy or drowsy from medicine or alcohol.
- Check with your local fire department for any restrictions before using a barbeque grill, fire pit, or chimenea.
- Check your school's rules before using electrical appliances in your room.

Below is not a complete list of recalls that have been issued since the last newsletter; the complete list is contained on their website. There is also information on a new app for mobile devices which allows for faster information from their website.

#### MTD Products Recalls Troy-Bilt Spacesavr Walk-Behind Self-Propelled Lawn Mowers Due to Fire Hazard

This recall involves Troy-Bilt SpaceSavr<sup>TM</sup> Walk-Behind Self-Propelled Lawn Mowers with model number TB220BXP SpaceSavr<sup>TM</sup> (12AVU2V3B66) which can be found on the white model plate located on the rear door. The mower is black with the name Troy-Bilt on the engine shroud and on the bagger.

There have been reports of the mower leaking fuel when it is stored in the upright (vertical) storage position, posing a fire hazard.

Consumers should stop using the mower, store the mower horizontally only and contact the store where purchased or Troy-Bilt to receive a full refund. MTD Products Inc. can be reached toll-free at 888-848-6038.

#### <u>SunVilla™ Corporation Recalls Solar LED</u> <u>Market Umbrellas Due to Fire and Burn</u> <u>Hazards; Sold Exclusively at Costco</u>

This recall involves all 10' Solar LED Market Umbrellas sold in a variety of colors. The umbrellas have LED lights on the arms of the umbrella and a black solar panel battery puck at the top of the umbrella. The solar puck has a black cover marked with "YEEZE" or "YEEZE 1." The lithium-ion batteries in the umbrella's solar panels can overheat, posing fire and burn hazards.

Consumers should immediately stop using the umbrellas, remove the solar panel puck containing a lithium-ion battery from the top of the umbrella, store the puck out of the sun and away from combustible material, and do not charge the puck with the AC adapter.

Consumers can return the umbrellas and solar puck to any Costco Warehouse nationwide for a full refund. Consumers unable to return the product to Costco can contact the firm for instructions on how to receive a refund. SunVilla and Costco are contacting all known purchasers. 
Hello East Granby Community Members!

#### **NEASC**

New England Association of Schools and Colleges is an organization that provides accreditation for Connecticut schools. Accreditation is a 10-year cycle that engages schools in a multi-tiered process of analysis, reflection, and planning. The key components of the process are:

- a Self-Reflection completed by the school
- a *Collaborative Conference* held with a small team of peer educators (from other districts)
- the development and implementation of a school growth plan
- a reflective summary report completed by the school
- a *personalized* Decennial Accreditation visit <u>https://cpemhs.neasc.org/process/process-2020</u>

East Granby High School is currently working towards their Decennial Accreditation visit in the Fall of 2022 and, as part of the process, is developing a district Vision (or Portrait) of a Graduate (PoG). NEASC states that a "Vision of the Graduate emphasizes a holistic view of expectations for students, including the transferable skills, content, understandings, and disposition that students should have by the time they graduate and method assessing student's progress toward that vision." а of а https://cpemhs.neasc.org/standards

Last year, the staff at East Granby High School and Middle School worked collaboratively in Professional Learning Community (PLC) teams to implement the Portrait of a Graduate

initiative. PLC teams created rubrics to assess student progress toward demonstrating empowered **c**itizenship, **c**ollaboration, **c**ritical thinking, **c**reative thinking, and being a precise **c**ommunicator. Students were engaged across all grade-levels focusing on those Five C's to foster learning.

As a culminating learning experience, seniors demonstrated their mastery of the POG initiative by designing, implementing, and presenting a Capstone Project before graduating.
