# Memorial Day Parade $\star$ May 29, 2023 $\star$ 10:00 AM



**Memorial Day** is proclaimed to be a day to honor all Americans who died in military service. Please join our community in remembering those who sacrificed their lives to keep us safe and preserve our freedoms at our Annual Memorial Day Parade & Program. Big thanks go to the East Granby Lions Club who sponsors the parade and the Connecticut Air National Guard who provides the Honor Guard & Flyover. Parade participants should assemble at 9:30 AM in front of the Elmwood Cemetery on Nicholson Road. The parade will begin at 10:00

AM, proceed down Nicholson Road, cross Route 20 to School Street, and cross Route 187 to the Town Campus where there will be a short memorial service. In case of rain, a ceremony will be held at the Town Hall Meeting Room at 10:00 AM.

*The 2023/2024 Town Budget Referendum* will be held on May 16th from 6:00 AM to 8:00 PM at the Senior/Community Center. Please go to www.eastgranbyct.org for information regarding the budget referendum results.

**Upcoming Town Meeting:** There will be a Town Meeting called in late June to close fiscal year-end accounts and to review and act upon Board of Selectmen and Board of Education capital requests. These capital requests are not for additional funding, but rather to access capital funds previously approved by the Town through the annual budget referendum. Signs will be placed around town announcing the date.

**The long-awaited East Granby Village Center Study** is complete and our consultant Goman+York will offer a hybrid presentation of the finished product to the public, including business & property owners, on Monday, May 22nd at 6:00 PM at the Senior/Community Center. Payment drop box is available 24 hours a day/7 days a week and is located at the back door of the Town Hall (facing the Police Department, Library, and Senior/Community Center). You still have an opportunity to mail your payment ON/OR before August 1st, 2023. We accept the United States Postmaster Stamp/Seal and recognize the payment as an on-time payment only if postmarked by August 1, 2023. Sorry, postage meters do not qualify as Postmaster Stamp/Seal.

### Did you sell a motor vehicle after 10/1/2022?

We will be sending you a bill the last week of June—why not see if you can have that adjustment now for the newest bill!

## News From the Registrars of Voters

### Are you registered to vote?

Residents aged 18 years or older by Election Day, November 7, 2023, and meeting eligibility requirements may register. Go to MyVote.CT.gov to check if you are already registered in East Granby. If not, you may register online at VoterRegistration.CT.gov using a current Connecticut DMV ID. To register by mail, download a Voter Registration Form at MyVote.CT.gov or email registrars@egtownhall.com to request an application. Mail completed forms to Registrar of Voters, 9 Center Street, East Granby, CT 06026. You may also register in person at the Registrars' Office in the Senior/Community Center on Tuesdays from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM.

Poll workers aged 18 and older must be registered voters but 16- and 17-year-old students who are residents of East Granby are also eligible to work a six-hour shift. ## June is Dog Licensing Month!



You can renew one of four ways: online, mail in, drop box, or in-person.

**Online renewal:** You'll need to know last year's tag number and rabies must be up to date. There is an additional \$1.75 processing fee. Simply go the our website, eastgranbyct.org, and click on "I Want To..."

or click on the Dog License tab of the Town Clerk's web page.

Mail in renewal: Include rabies certificate if updating is needed.

**Drop box:** The box is located outside Town Hall. Include rabies certificate if updating is needed.

Once we receive the information we will process and mail the license and dog tags back to you. Please note we cannot issue change so please leave exact dollar amount. Altered dogs are \$8.00, unaltered are \$19.00.

All dogs six months and older must be licensed by June 30th. A \$1.00 late fee will be charged each month for dogs not licensed starting July 1st. All dogs must have proof of a current rabies vaccination on file. If you no longer own a dog please let us know; you telling us is the only way we find out.

When licensing by mail, please include a self-addressed envelope with 70¢ postage and mail it to: Town Clerk, 9 Center Street, East Granby, CT 06026. No monies will be collected prior to June 1st.

All reminder notices are being sent via email only. If we have your email on file you have received a reminder; check your junk/spam mail. Failure to receive a reminder notice does not excuse the obligation of renewing your dog license (per CGS 22-338).

# Swimming Pool Season

## News from the Building Department

As the swimming season is just around the corner, the Town of East Granby Building Department would like to remind residents of safety and code regulations regarding all pools. The adopted



current Connecticut state building code regulates pool installations and requirements. The code maintains that permits for the pool and its various electrical components are required. Safety

barriers are required for pools so outside easy access is held to a minimum. These barriers, such as fencing and self-closing gates, help deter individuals from entering the pool area. Alarms are required in the pool and to doors/windows that allow direct access to the pool area. Motion of the doors/windows or movement in the pool will sound an alarm to allow others to hear that the area has been breached.

Most individuals understand that water and electricity do not mix. Inspections for pool electrical components allow for a safe pool season regardless of the pool. Pool companies generally pull permits and hire licensed electricians to ensure that the job is done correctly to code and meets the safety regulations of the code and the manufacturers. Box store pools such as the blue rubber pools still require the needed permits for safe usage, including the barrier, ladder safety, GFCI breaker for the pump, electrical components, and much more.

There have been many permits pulled for pools and some have not had complete inspections, or none at all. Some permits have not been closed for a number of reasons. Closing a permit indicates all required inspections have been done and passed. Insurance companies prefer to see that the permit is closed—if an accident occurs and the permit is open, a problem with the insurance company may ensue. Pools with no permits where an incident occurs are an even bigger issue when it comes to liability. Please be sure to have your pool properly permitted and inspected, and have a safe swimming season!

## **Commission on Aging**

The Commission on Aging (COA) advocates for the senior community in town and needs help to continue doing so on an efficient basis. The Commission, as constituted, has nine members and three alternates. The Commission has two openings for an alternate. Please help us out. **Pavilion on the Senior/Community Center:** This will be a 12' by 20' structure placed on the concrete pad outside the Senior/Community Center. This has been made possible by a bequest from Bea Adams, a long-time resident of East Granby. The pavilion is on order and hopefully will be set up this summer.

pay for a household's primary heating source such as oil, natural gas, electricity, propane, kerosene, coal, wood, and wood pellets. #### Renter's Rebate

The Elderly/Totally Disabled Renters rebate program is open until October 1st for seniors aged 65 and over (or under 65 and



on permanent long-term disability receiving Social Security benefits) that rented in 2022 and have a total income less than \$40,300 for a single person and less than \$49,100 per

married couple. Renters' rebates can be up to \$900 for married couples and \$700 for single persons. The renters' rebate amount is based on a graduated income scale and the amount of rent and utility payments made in the previous calendar year. There is no asset restriction. The Original Fly Girls: A History of the Women Airforce Service Pilots Sunday, June 4th at 2:30 PM East Granby Senior/Community Center Presented by Dr. Amanda Goodheart Parks Free and open to the public

## **East Granby Republicans**

As this publication goes to print, there are two very important events in the near future. There was a town meeting on May 2nd to discuss



the 2023-2024 budget. Soon afterward there is expected to be a town-wide referendum to approve or reject the budget. All local residents and businesses are encouraged to attend, and vote.

A brief refresher on how property taxes are determined is presented here. Property taxes comprise the vast majority (87%) of East Granby's revenues, and the sum total of all property is called the Grand List. The three main components are: Motor Vehicles, Real Estate, and Personal Property (business equipment and machines). As mentioned in the previous "Let's Talk Turkey," the increase has amounted to less than one percent (0.84% actual) over the last seven years. Budget increases over this amount mean higher property taxes.

Recently, East Granby had an opportunity for a sizable increase on our Grand List. A well-respected developer had a prospective client who would occupy a planned storage facility. The developer requested a change to a local ordinance for a modest increase in allowable building size. Our Planning and Zoning commission voted to reject this request. The building would have brought in an estimated \$2 million. Reasonable limits on hours of operation and noise levels would have made the operation workable to the client and acceptable to adjoining residents.

Adding to our woes as a municipality is the State of Connecticut meddling in local affairs. The State has mandated that taxes on Motor Vehicles be capped at 32.46 mills. Since our expected mill rate exceeds this threshold (overall rate of 35.8), this will cause an increase in mill rate on Real Estate and Personal Property to 36.3. In addition, there is proposed legislation that would change the assessment rate on property from the existing 70% to 75%.

## **Capitol Update**

## Rep. Tami Zawistowski, 61st District



Late April at the State Capitol marked the end of the committee process for lawmakers and the transition to more regular debate on the House floor. For a couple of weeks, the Capitol campus was at a lull as legislators and staff prepared for the final stretch of the session. As Chair of House Republican

Screening, I worked closely with caucus colleagues to analyze bills expected to reach the House floor and weigh them with a view to protecting our communities. Amidst these quietly busy weeks in Hartford, fellow legislators and I continue to hear constituent concerns on many issues, especially public safety.

Many of us have seen recent footage online or in the news of a middle-aged man fighting off four masked juveniles attempting to steal a car out of his driveway in Rocky Hill. The broad daylight attack was shocking—and infuriating. It is also only one example of many crimes that have become more brazen in recent years.

The "smart on crime" approach to public safety pushed through the legislature in recent years but opposed by my colleagues and I clearly isn't working. We need to reconsider and amend these laws that reduce police effectiveness, soften criminal penalties, facilitate early release for even convicted murderers and in many cases treat the criminals with more care than that afforded to victims.

Closer to home, we've seen an attempted carjacking on Route 75 in Windsor Locks, a multi-street takeover in Simsbury, catalytic converter thefts, and car break-ins throughout our area. Locking your car is important but doesn't work as a deterrent when thieves are smashing the windows. While car break-ins and catalytic converter thefts are disregarded by some as "only property crimes," the level of criminal activity can escalate when there are no meaningful consequences for these actions.

This session, Republicans offered a package of public safety proposals that included expanding the circumstances under which juveniles charged with certain violent crimes are automatically transferred to the adult criminal docket, and adding another two years to the mandatory minimum sentence for carjacking when a firearm or deadly weapon is involved. We have also proposed reversing some of the restrictions the legislature imposed on police in the past few years that have impeded their ability to enforce existing laws.

We have responded to the concerns of our constituents—and have also worked with several of our state's big city mayors, almost all Democrats, in crafting some of this legislation. Unfortunately, our proposals aimed at instilling more accountability into Connecticut's criminal justice system have been received coolly by our majority party colleagues in the legislature. While I am not extremely optimistic about these ideas being adopted, I will continue to push for reforms holding criminals accountable and offering additional support to crime victims.



# **Traprock Ridge Land Conservancy**



## Traprock Ridge Land Conservancy Officially Established!

On April 10, 2023, Traprock Ridge Land Conservancy was established with plans to help our communities protect the environment, preserve local farming and connect residents with the outdoors. This completes the legal steps of a merger process set in motion when members of East Granby Land Trust, West Hartford Land Trust, and Bloomfield's Wintonbury Land Trust voted earlier this year to combine forces.

Amanda Thompson, President of the Traprock Ridge Land Conservancy board of directors and President of the former East Granby Land Trust said, "Our land trusts served important roles preserving open space to maintain the character and quality of life residents enjoy in our communities. The formation of Traprock Ridge Land Conservancy will help the region better promote farmland, waterways, wildlife habitat, outdoor recreation and education for the benefit of current and future generations."

The land trust's mission is to conserve, improve and study the region's natural resources for the public's benefit, including the traprock ridge shared by the three towns and the Farmington River and Park River watersheds. The merger plan honors restrictions on how previously donated lands can be used and continues projects already underway in each town. Members and volunteers now protect a combined 49 properties totaling 642 acres that include numerous nature preserves, four working farms, community gardens and education programs.

### Pooling Resources to Boost and Sustain Efforts

Victor Herson, President of the former Wintonbury Land Trust in Bloomfield and a member of the new land trust board said, "We are excited to join forces with our neighbors and strengthen efforts to conserve land and connect people with nature. Traprock Ridge Land Conservancy will provide the foundation for efficiencies and expanding resources that ensure sustainability and success in the future." David Sagers, Traprock Ridge Land Conservancy's Treasurer and President of the former West Hartford Land Trust, added, "The merger is the culmination of almost two years of collaboration and planning to increase the sustainability of land acquisition and conservation in our community. This brings together a larger group of like-minded supporters to significantly increase our impact on the environment across the region."

### Forging the Partnership

Leaders from the three land trusts began exploring opportunities to work together in 2021 during workshops with the Connecticut Land Conservation Council. The Council provides training and recommends policies to ensure the long-term viability of land conservation efforts in the state.

The land trusts received a grant from The Peter and Carmen Lucia Buck Foundation to study the feasibility of merging and to develop a plan. Representatives worked with Sharon Danosky, president and owner of the Danosky & Associates consulting firm, and Ed Spinella, chair of the tax-exempt organizations group at the law offices of Murtha Cullina. The Pro Bono Partnership also provided free legal services from Donna Brooks and Tyler Archer at Shipman & Goodwin and Matthew Schernecke, Zohra Sayedy, Aafke Pronk, Rob Cortinas, and Ronald Silverman at Hogan Lovells.

Aaron Lefland, Deputy Director of the Connecticut Land Conservation Council, noted, "Land trusts make a promise to conserve land in perpetuity. East Granby, West Hartford and Wintonbury Land Trusts have demonstrated their commitment to upholding that promise by coming together to form a stronger, more enduring organization."

Bob Canace, Senior Program Officer at The Peter and Carmen Lucia Buck Foundation, added, "The Foundation congratulates the East Granby, West Hartford and Wintonbury Land Trusts for having the vision to map out a new future that will take advantage of each organization's history, enthusiasm and vision to continue protecting natural areas and offering community-based programs."

## **Getting Involved**

Traprock Ridge Land Conservancy's new board of directors met for the first time on April 26 in Bloomfield. Members of the merging land trusts elected directors and officers from each of the three towns, including student directors from East Granby Land Trust's internship program. Members and volunteers will organize new committees for Land Acquisition, Land Conservation, Education & Outreach, Fundraising & Membership, Governance, and Finance.

## ★ East Granby Youth Service Bureau

The mission of the East Granby Service Bureau is to coordinate the delivery of community-based services for prevention, intervention, treatment, and follow up for at risk youth, and to provide opportunities for all youth to function as responsible members of the community.

## ★ Commission on Youth Services

The Commission on Youth Services (CYS) was established to serve in an advisory capacity and support the mission and staff of the Youth Services Bureau. Members are appointed by the board of selectmen and represent various segments of the community including law enforcement, education, children and families, and local businesses and organizations.

The goal of the CYS is to advocate for our youth population by evaluating priority needs and interests on an ongoing basis and assisting the YSB in the development of appropriate programs and services. Meetings are held every 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of the month and are open to the public.

## ★ Counseling Services

Counseling services addressing emotional, behavioral, and mental health issues are available for children and families residing in East Granby. We provide parenting support, family therapy, individual therapy, play therapy for children, referrals, and school consultation. School, Parent, and Self-referrals are accepted. All services are professional and confidential and are offered free of charge to East Granby residents.

## ★ Juvenile Review Board

The East Granby Juvenile Review Board provides a community-based program for diverting eligible juvenile cases from the Juvenile Justice System, supporting families with service needs, and providing intervention at the local level. ## ★ Youth Action Council (YAC)

## East Granby Public Schools Curriculum Overview for 2022-23

Each spring, the Curriculum Leaders across the district submit a synopsis of new initiatives and exciting news from their grade levels, departments, and building, which is compiled into a lengthy document. This article highlights just some of the many new building or district initiatives, as well as extra learning opportunities (such as guest speakers and field trips tied to curriculum).

Our K-5 buildings both implemented the new math program, iReady Classroom Mathematics and are loving the specificity of the data they receive. Another K-5 initiative is the use of mClass DIBELS Benchmark Assessment System, which provides a set of measures for assessing reading skills and gives a menu of activities for students based on their composite scores. Teachers can monitor progress to track student growth and determine next steps for development. The third graders had a deeper study of phonemic awareness and phonics through the Really Great Reading program.

Carl Allgrove Elementary students learned outside of the classroom, too, with visits to the EG fire station, post office, library, Historical Society, and nature trail (depending on their grade). We were fortunate to have the Children's Museum StarLab Traveling Planetarium and the Connecticut Science Center bring three science units to our school.

R.D. Seymour Elementary students also enjoyed learning experiences outside the classroom or through guest presenters. A Mohegan Tribe's Educators Project representative visited third grade. Fourth graders visited the CT Historical Society to support the immigration social studies unit. Students investigated the "push and pull factors" that cause people to immigrate. Grade 5 went to STARBASE, a five-day STEM-based academy where students collaborate to explore various STEM fields, using the Scientific Method to conduct experiments in chemistry and physics. They observe and analyze data to draw conclusions about the world.

In elementary Art, all third graders are creating a class Barn Quilt Square that will be on permanent display at Seymour School, Allgrove School, and East Granby Farms. This was made possible through funding provided by the PTO. The K-5 Art Show is May 18<sup>th</sup>, 2023, at Allgrove. A sensory- friendly showing for special needs students is 5:30-6 pm, with public viewing from 6 -7:15 PM.

The physical education teachers in K-5 led the drive to raise money for the American Heart Association Kids Heart Challenge, with Allgrove raising \$9,212.52 and Seymour raising \$14,522,22. Both schools have their annual field day upcoming in June, which is run by the PE teachers, with lots of support from school staff and families!

In technology class, fifth grade students are preparing a Stop Motion Animation project using iPads, LEGO and other materials. EGPS students begin coding in kindergarten and continue learning more advanced skills each year. Our K-5 library time focused on exploring new books from different genres that incorporate Social Emotional Learning topics and diversity. The annual Read Across America celebration was a huge success with Seymour and Allgrove students gathering together for a morning activity. At the middle school library, weekly student newscasts were generated by sixth graders, which featured original student work from the EGMS digital multi-media design class using the Stop Motion Studio app.

Elementary music had multiple in-person concerts, the first since 2019. It was joyous to see the children performing for their families. These concerts ranged from grade-level performances to the 4th and 5th grade chorus and band. Watch for upcoming spring performances in June! The Seymour Players - 34 students from 4th and 5th, presented "A Friendship Show," which was a big success!

In English, the middle and high students won multiple awards across a variety of writing contests. EGMS students received 7 awards in the 2023 UCONN Student Writing Contest. Their work was selected from over 1,600 state entries in three categories: fiction, non-fiction, and poetry. All honorees had their names published in the Connecticut Student Writers Magazine and the Gold award winner had his entire work published. Eighth graders submitted reflective writing pieces to the UCONN Letters About Literature Writing Contest and 58% of our 8th graders were recognized among the 849 submissions. Among the awards were 5 Honorable Mentions, 33 Silver Medals, and the Top Prize for Grades 7-8.

Our high school English students were equally successful. Nine students were published in Young Writers: Twisted Tales. One ninth grade student received two platinum awards for a short story and a poem through the UCONN Connecticut Writers Contest. A student received recognition from the Daughters of the American Revolution National Headquarters as the national essay winner of Patriots of the American Revolution High School Essay competition. She will share her essay with an audience of thousands in June at Constitution Hall in Washington, D.C.

In the Family & Consumer Science department (FCS), students learned about personal banking from the Granby Peoples Bank. Later this month, The Johnson Wales Culinary rep will review careers in the food service industry. The International Culinary class teamed up with Manufacturing students, with FCS creatively designed charcuterie boards using the handcrafted cutting boards made by manufacturing students. The manufacturing students judged the designs and shared in the tasty presentation. Also, our Child Development class offered Toddler Time this fall to 8 local youngsters, reopening after COVID.

In Manufacturing, Engineering, and Technology courses, students are working with the Tello drones, programming them for synchronized LED displays. Manufacturing II students are working on their flagship project: the National Science Foundation STEM Electric Guitar Project. Students who already know how to play the guitar will develop a series of lessons to teach their peers.

Our Mathematics department implemented more Project Based assessments tailored to individual student needs and/or interests. The EGHS teachers have experimented with Defined Learning Assignments, access to these lessons provided by the CT State Department of Education, that incorporate project based learning into mathematics. A department goal for next year is to build Thinking Classrooms across the department.

The Physical Education and Health department continues to focus on personal growth and student accountability. For health, they used a new SEL curriculum, understanding internet/social media effects (for both safety, reliability, and kindness) and some of the Choose Love curriculum. (It was created by Scarlett Lewis after her son was murdered during the Sandy Hook Elementary School) The classes addressed internet and social media effects for safety, reliability, and kindness.

Three EGMS Invention Convention students were chosen by a panel of administrators and the science curriculum leader to compete in the State Championships. Their projects were *Non-Shatter Wrap*, which protects plates against breaking; *Page Tracker*, which is a special bookmark that keeps track of your page even if it falls out; and *YAAD*, a digitally timed medication dispenser.

In Social Studies news, two 8th graders placed in this year's Abigail Phelps Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution Essay Competition. Students wrote historical fiction stories from the perspective of a delegate to the Continental Congress between 1775-1776.

Additionally in social studies, the certification process of the UCONN ECE class allows us to teach two different classes at East Granby High School that are UConn accredited classes: Early US History (Colonization of America to the Civil War) and Modern US History (Reconstruction to Modern Times). Community service was the focus for the sophomore Civics classes, which partnered with the Council on Aging and provided East Granby residents with assistance in cleaning up their yards in the fall and the spring. Students raked leaves and performed a variety of other outdoor tasks to fulfill their community service requirement for the class.

For the World Language Department, our Spanish II and Spanish II Advanced classes are very well received by the students, and will prepare them to advance to high levels. The Spanish library continues to be a useful resource for all levels of Spanish students. EGMS seventh graders begin basic conjugation of verbs and learn a variety of authentic expressions in order to communicate in the target language. There are four levels with students advancing from studying families, celebrations, relationships and authentic products...all the way up to building communication skills on the topic of friendship and relationships and are demonstrating authentic use of the subjunctive language through advice, recommendations and suggestions.

In Art 6-12, EGHS expanded and updated cameras for Photography and AP Art History class completing an installation mural. EGHS had two student recipients for the Connecticut Association of Schools Award for visual and performing arts.

This year in the Business Dept., architectural software for building stadiums was incorporated into Sports Marketing & Entertainment. The Future Business Leaders of America Jr (8th grade) created products for Shark Tank investor presentations.

The middle and high school band and chorus has over 20 performances between their school and numerous community gigs for our town and beyond. Performances included Veterans Day, The Big E, and more. Our music students were selected to perform at the NCCC Music Festival, the C.M.E.A. Northern Region HS Music Festival. Musical Theater & Drama (HS) and Intro to Theater Class (MS) ran this year. This year's play, Legally Blonde JR, by the MS and HS Drama Club students was great fun! Be sure to mark the HS Spring Concert (5/24), the EG Memorial Parade (5/29) and the MS Spring concert (5/31) on your calendar.

As in the past, this year our faculty, staff, and administrators have made great efforts to meet student needs, both academic and social-emotional. We are working on closing the gaps and implementing strategies to help our students move forward.


