It's Been a Busy Summer & Fall is Just Around the Corner!

FY 2022/2023 Approved Operating Budget: East Granby taxpayers voted and approved the annual budget on May 16th with 230 in favor and 139 opposed. A total of 10% of eligible voters voted. Following the vote, the Board of Finance set the mill rate at 36.3 mills.

Parks & Recreation Event: The Last Blast of Summer Concert featuring the band "Still Kickin' with the Big City Horns" will be held on the Town Hall Campus green Friday, August 25th from 6:30 to 8:00 PM. Come join us...it will be fun for all!

Public Safety Open House/Free Pancake Breakfast: The Granby Ambulance Association (GAA) Sponsored Pancake Breakfast will be held on Saturday, August 26th from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM at the Ambulance Building on Veterans Memorial Drive within our Town Hall Campus. Enjoy pancakes and meet & greet with the staff and volunteers of the GAA, Fire Department, and Police Department.

Grants, Grants! Town Hall departments and staff are actively mining new grant opportunities. Our Town Planner, Robin Newton, applied for and won a \$2.875 million dollar Local Transportation Capital Improvement Program (LOTCIP) grant through Capital Region Council of Governments (CRCOG) for the realignment of School Street in our Village Center. This is a huge accomplishment and opportunity. This project will include a realignment of School Street at key areas and will provide for sidewalks for pedestrians for the entire length of the road. We will be working with CRCOG to iron out the details and hopefully begin the project within the next year.

Robin also recently submitted an application for a Community Connectivity Grant Program (CCGP) for up to \$800,000 for sidewalks within the Town Campus including from Center Street along Route 20 in front of the Center Shops to along Route 187 (South Main Street) to the Town Campus. We are eagerly waiting to hear if the application will be chosen!

The Fire Department just applied for a \$42,800 FEMA grant for the installation of a vehicle mounted exhaust protection system for the Firehouse. The system we have now is antiquated and in desperate need of updating. We are hopeful to be chosen as we were for last year's FEMA breathing apparatus grant in the amount of \$209,524.76!

Senior/Community Center: The Commission on Aging was recently bequeathed \$22,000 and voted to install a beautifully built and functional outdoor pavilion. Keep an eye out in September's edition of "Let's Talk Turkey" for a special dedication ceremony. The pavilion oversees the beauty surrounding it, including Doreen's nature trail.

Economic Development: A Small Business Passport Program is scheduled to launch on August 25th! Participating East Granby businesses will be listed in the passport. Your job is to visit as many businesses as possible and collect passport stamps up to and through Small Business Saturday, November 25th. The program will culminate with a cash prize drawing for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places! Stop by Town Hall the week of August 21st to pick up your passport! This is a great opportunity for town residents to support small businesses. I envision this program expanding as our long-term Economic Development vision comes into fruition.

"Welcome To East Granby" Signs Town-Wide Fundraiser: You asked and we listened! Mark your calendars! A fundraiser for professionally designed and crafted road signs will be hosted at Almost Famous Brewery on Friday, October 6th from 4:00 to 7:00 PM. This fundraiser is sponsored and organized by PeoplesBank, Bradley Regional Chamber of Commerce, and Economic Development. All residents and East Granby businesses are encouraged to attend. Keep an eye out in September's "Let's Talk Turkey" for sponsorship opportunities and fundraiser details.

East Granby Lions Rubber Duck Derby

Sunday, September 10th

Get ready for the most exciting spectator sport in East Granby! The 11th Annual East Granby Lions Rubber Duck Derby is coming to town! Imagine a thousand rubber ducks racing down



the river towards the finish line with hundreds of people alongside the riverbank cheering on their adopted duck, hoping it will finish in the money.

Here's how you can participate: Adopt a duck (purchase a ticket). Ducks are \$5 each. Each ticket has a number corresponding to the number printed on each duck. On September 10th, the ducks will be ceremoniously released from the Greenway bike bridge over Salmon Brook. They have to survive the fall from the bridge and then swim to the finish line at Granbrook Park. The ducks who are able to navigate all the hazards, keep from getting trapped in obstacles in the water, and cross the finish line downstream are the winners. Prizes include \$500, \$250 and \$100 in cash and various gift cards to area restaurants and businesses.



Festivities at Granbrook Park begin at 11:00 AM on September 10th. There will be burgers, hot dogs, and other refreshments as well as games and prizes for kids. It's fun for the whole family! The Rubber Duck Derby is the major fundraiser for our Lions Club. The Lions are all volunteers, so 100% of all money raised goes towards providing scholarships and contributing to local organizations and charities. If everyone in town just adopts one duck for the race, we could do so much more!

Ducks can be adopted at the East Granby Library or at Town Hall. They are also available at the RCC (a.k.a. The Dump), Geissler's, and Stop & Shop on select Saturdays. Ducks are also sold by all Lion members. Adopt your duck today! You



don't need to attend the Duck Race to win, but we hope you can be there so you can give your duck a pep talk and then root it on to victory!

You can also adopt ducks using Venmo. Scan this QR code to make a payment. The Lions will respond with your duck

number(s) based on the amount of payment, e.g., \$5, \$10, \$15, \$20, etc. Follow the ducks on Facebook as they prepare for the big race at "East Granby Lions Club Rubber Duck Derby."

The fund is supported solely through donations and gifts from the community and 100% of the funds raised are given back to qualifying residents who are facing financial hardship. Donations can be made to the "East Granby Emergency Assistance Fund" and mailed to East Granby Social Services, 20 Center Street, East Granby, CT 06026.

Energy Assistance: Applications will be taken after October 1st from residents of East Granby who wish to apply for the CT Energy Assistance Program. New this year, applications can also be made on-line. This program is designed to help offset the winter heating costs of Connecticut's lower income households. Winter heating assistance helps pay for a household's primary heating source such as oil, natural gas, electricity, propane, kerosene, coal, wood, and wood pellets. 

Operation Fuel: Operation Fuel offers emergency energy assistance to households who fall outside the Connecticut Energy Assistance guidelines or have exhausted their Connecticut Energy Assistance grant. Applications can be completed through East Granby Social Services or directly through the Operation Fuel website: https://operationfuel.org/gethelp/.

Renter's Rebate: The Elderly/Totally Disabled Renters Rebate Program is open until October 1st for seniors aged 65 and over (or under 65 and on permanent long-term disability receiving Social Security benefits) that rented in 2022 and have a total income less than \$40,300 for a single person and less than \$49,100 per married couple. Renters' rebates can be up to \$900 for married couples and \$700 for single persons. The renters' rebate amount is based on a graduated income scale and the amount of rent and utility payments made in the previous calendar year. There is no asset restriction. Please call Social Services for more information or to apply.

East Granby Historical Society

A Cow in the Historical Society Barn? This cow face which appears to look out the window is actually a painted barn quilt square, a project of R.D. Seymour School students. Art teacher



Polly Vouglas writes: "A barn quilt square is an American folk art movement where a traditional or more modern quilt square pattern is painted on a wood panel and displayed on the side of a barn. These quilt squares generally have personal meaning to the one who displays it or a tie-in to

local history. During their third grade school year, R.D. Seymour art students learned how to organize and manipulate the elements of art and principles of design into different quilt square patterns. They took what they learned in art class and collaborative interactions with East Granby Historical Society president, Nancy Moody, and Granbees quilter, Karen Hines, to design and create a barn quilt square that was meaningful and representative of the East Granby Farms venue." A Lecture at Old New-Gate Prison & Copper Mine: "Revolutionary Connections to Old New-Gate Prison: British Soldiers, Loyalists, and an Infamous Counterfeiter" will be presented by Don N. Hagist on Sunday, September 17th at 5:00 PM at the guard house of Old New-Gate

Capitol Update

Rep. Tami Zawistowski, 61st District

June brought the end of the 2023 legislative session after long days of intense debate and deliberation on important bills. Here are some which may be of interest.

FY 2024-25 State Budget: Every two years, the legislature must pass a two-year state budget. This year the



budget garnered significant bipartisan support by incorporating many Republican initiatives included in the fully vetted alternative budget developed by my colleagues and I earlier in the year. The final approved budget included a state income tax reduction for many middle- and low-income earners and families, additional funding for vital services by nonprofits, increases to local education funding, and further tax relief for seniors through an adjustment to the eligibility levels on retirement income. It also made a significant financial commitment toward reducing and eventually eliminating the autism lifetime waiver waitlist. The budget reduces the size of state government and saves \$200 million in excess spending by having state agencies adopt hiring practices that are more consistent with practices in non-governmental organizations. While I do not agree with all that was included in the omnibus budget and implementer legislation, I was happy to support it especially for the financial relief to taxpayers.

Transportation and Road Safety: To address growing safety concerns on Connecticut roadways, the legislature acted to implement additional effective road safety measures, like rumble strips and enhanced lighting features to deter wrong way drivers which have become far too common in our state. Public Act 23-51 passed both the House and Senate with broad bipartisan support. While enforcing existing laws concerning impaired driving—from alcohol, cannabis, or other influences—is paramount, these new measures may be a first line of defense to help prevent further highway fatalities.

Protecting Seniors from Fraud: Financial predators and scammers often prey upon older citizens who may be vulnerable to convincing stories and alarming pleas. P.A. 23-161 will provide more protections for seniors by authorizing disclosures and

temporary account holds by financial institutions, probate courts, and advisors to prevent the financial exploitation of state residents aged 60 or older.

News from Old New-Gate Prison & Copper Mine: Congratulations to Friends of Old New-Gate on completing a beautiful new entrance to the visitor center and construction of a new picnic area outside the museum walls! With assistance from the Town of East Granby, these improvements provide a more attractive and accessible walkway and a welcoming place to enjoy the outstanding views. Old New-Gate applied for an important grant from the National Parks Service in 2022, and July brought good news. The museum will receive \$750,000 to support rehabilitation of Viets' Tavern located across the street from the prison. The grant is part of the Semiquincentennial Grant program commemorating the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States. The program was created by Congress in 2020 and is funded through the Historic Preservation Fund. I am particularly excited that the grant will eventually provide public access to Viets' Tavern.

Park Updates

East Granby Farms:

A barn quilt piece has been installed on the side of the Historical Society Museum facing the East Granby Farms South Entrance (79 N. Main Street). A form of Americana folk art that preserves the country's guilting tradition and a communities' regional heritage, barn quilt pieces are large pieces of wood painted to look like quilt blocks. This barn quilt piece honors East Granby Farm's history as a dairy farm. This wonderful initiative is from Polly Voglus, Allgrove/Seymour Art teacher, and the creativity of East Granby Class of 2032's R.D. Seymour School Art Class. Thank you to Karen Hines from the East Granby Parks and Recreation Commission, and the East Granby Historical Society for their help in making this vision become a reality.

East Granby Farms is now home to a Little Library, donated last year by the Building Blocks Early Learning Center. It will be stocked with books in the coming weeks, and we encourage you to take one/leave one when you visit East Granby Farms Recreation Area. This Little Library was a part of the Building Blocks Early Learning Center's literacy initiative in 2022. We appreciate the creativity of our youngest readers in town, and patience as we worked out how best to display their hard work.

Coming soon... a NEW basketball hoop that will replace the tired old one!

The East Granby Farms Recreation Building is available to town residents for event rental. The fee is \$25 per hour, and we encourage residents to take advantage of the beautiful space. Cowles Park:

The trails at Cowles Park are busy year-round and this summer has been no exception! The well-maintained hiking and biking trails are open to the public and available to residents and non-residents to use. The main parking lot on Rte. 187 is the most easily accessed parking area.

Thank you to the numerous volunteers from NEMBA (New England Mountain Biking Association) for the countless hours they spend maintaining the trails. To stay updated on their work and be informed of trail closings/openings, follow the Cowles Park Singletrack on Facebook. They are currently building and perfecting an Adaptive Mountain Biking (aMTB) Loop. Please call the Parks & Rec Office (860) 653-7660 or send a message to the Cowles Park Singletrack folks if you are an adaptive rider and would like to sample the course and/or assist with their efforts.

For now, trail maps can be found in the main parking lot; however, our volunteers and Parks & Rec Commission members are working to update the trail maps and make them available on our website. Please remember this is a Carry It In/ Carry It Out location and dogs must always be leashed.

The East Granby Greenway:

Part of the Farmington Valley Greenway multi-use trail, the East Granby Greenway runs from Rte. 189 to Rte. 20 and continues north to Copper Hill Road. This paved path is a wonderful option for those looking for a smoother ride/walk. Dogs must be leashed, and please remember to always be aware of your surroundings and share the trail. While it remains open year-round, the Greenway is not plowed in winter months to allow for snow shoeing and cross-country skiing.

Granbrook Park:

Located at the end of Granbrook Park Road, this property is part of The Town of East Granby Park System. Please remember that dogs must be leashed, fires are by permit only the park closes at sunset, and this is a Carry It In/ Carry It Out location.

Granbrook Park hosted yet another awesome summer of East Granby Parks & Recreation's Day Camp, Camp Granbrook. Over the course of seven weeks, one hundred fifty campers, ages 5-12, shared part of their summer with us, bringing the park alive with their energy and enthusiasm.





This summer brought many challenges with littering, vandalism, partying, and excessive noise. This prompted a public reminder that the park is closed from dusk to dawn, and the subsequent locking of the access gate each evening. We hoped this would curb the disruptive behavior and fortunately, it seems to have worked. At this time, we are not implementing any additional measures; however, we will continue to monitor the situation and any further discussions and/or decisions will be at the discretion of the Parks & Recreation Commission.

★ East Granby Youth Service Bureau

The mission of the East Granby Service Bureau is to coordinate the delivery of communitybased services for prevention, intervention, treatment, and follow up for at risk youth, and to provide opportunities for all youth to function as responsible members of the community.

★ Commission on Youth Services

The Commission on Youth Services (CYS) was established to serve in an advisory capacity and support the mission and staff of the Youth Services Bureau. Members are appointed by the board of selectmen and represent various segments of the community including law enforcement, education, children and families, and local businesses and organizations.

The goal of the CYS is to advocate for our youth population by evaluating priority needs and interests on an ongoing basis and assisting the YSB in the development of appropriate programs and services. Meetings are held every 3rd Monday of the month and are open to the public.

★ Counseling Services

Counseling services addressing emotional, behavioral, and mental health issues are available for children and families residing in East Granby. We provide parenting support, family therapy, individual therapy, play therapy for children, referrals, and school consultation. School, Parent, and Self-referrals are accepted. All services are professional and confidential and are offered free of charge to East Granby residents.

★ Juvenile Review Board

The East Granby Juvenile Review Board provides a community-based program for diverting eligible juvenile cases from the Juvenile Justice System, supporting families with service needs, and providing intervention at the local level. ★ Youth Action Council (YAC)

The Youth Action Councils are groups of youth in grades 6-8 and 9-12, brought together to work on the common goals of discovering the needs, increasing public awareness, and actively serving East Granby youth, their needs, interests, and concerns. Just like the name implies: this is a group of ACTION! Leadership skills are developed while the YAC members choose the projects, then plan & execute all aspects of them.



EAST GRANBY HIGH SCHOOL CLASS OF 2023



NEASC

New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) is an organization that provides accreditation for Connecticut schools. Accreditation is a 10-year cycle that engages schools in a multi-tiered process of analysis, reflection, and planning. The key components of the process are:

- a Self-Reflection completed by the school
- a Collaborative Conference held with a small team of peer educators (from other districts)
- the development and implementation of a school growth plan
- a reflective summary report completed by the school
- a personalized Decennial Accreditation visit https://cpemhs.neasc.org/process/process-2020

East Granby High School concluded their NEASC Accreditation process during the 2022-2023 school year. The school was officially informed through a letter stating that EGHS has met all requirements for continued accreditation.

The accreditation process began with a Collaborative Conference in Fall of 2020. A visiting committee toured and met with many members of the school community including the Board Of Education, staff, parents/guardians, and students. As part of the Collaborative Conference phase of accreditation, EGHS self-reflected on NEASC's Five Foundational Elements: Learning Culture, Student Learning, Professional Practices, Learning Support, and Learning Resources.

The NEASC Decennial Visit occurred in the Fall of 2022. An Accreditation team visited and spent three days in the building analyzing, rating and presenting to faculty what would formally become the school's Accreditation results.

The report's final findings are as follows: EGHS was rated as "Meets the Standard" for all Foundational Elements for Accreditation. NEASC provided us with nine commendations as well as three recommendations for improvement. You may read the report on the East Granby High School Website, under "For Parents."

The NEASC Accreditation process is a beneficial exercise that allows for continued learning to occur from the feedback provided through multiple stakeholders perspectives. The process is an excellent way to self-reflect and grow as a building in order to improve the goals of teaching and learning.

TEACHING & LEARNING

Allgrove and Seymour Elementary Schools will be shifting their literacy instruction to an approach that is more deeply rooted in the science of reading. Core instruction will support reading development in the areas of phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, oral language and comprehension. During the spring of 2022, teachers evaluated different programs and overwhelmingly chose Savaas My View. Initial professional development for teachers was held in March. Continued professional development will occur in August as teachers begin implementing Savaas My View.

East Granby Middle School will begin implementing new programs to vertically align with K-5 curriculum and instruction in reading and math by using Savaas My View and iReady Math as teaching and assessment tools. Teachers will have professional development in August to facilitate this shift. EGMS teachers will also be implementing Smarter Balanced Interim Comprehensive Assessments and Smarter Balanced Interim Assessment Blocks to gather formative and summative assessment data to target their instruction for improved learning in Math, Reading, and Writing.

East Granby High School will continue to use multiple learning pathways in our curriculum as we challenge students to become critical thinkers, creators, communicators, collaborators, and empowered citizens. Using data to inform instruction will be a focus throughout the 2023-2024 school year to address improvement in all aspects of teaching and learning. We will continue to evaluate and update our curriculum to meet state and national standards in order to advance student learning.


