# Bonding Proposal Town Meeting

January 31, 2019
East Granby Community Center

### Background

- ▶ The Capital Advisory Committee report issued in May of 2014 identified town infrastructure needs including roads and roofs.
- ▶ BOE & BOF have identified school roofs as a concern since 2015.
- ▶ BOS identified town roof replacement in the 5-year capital plan since 2015. For many years the BOS has spoken to the need for more road funding to keep up with deterioration.
- ➤ The Bonding Committee was established in December 2016 and was tasked with evaluating infrastructure projects for a potential bond issue. Report issued Dec 2018.
  - ► The Bonding Committee utilized the Capital Advisory Report and needs identified by the BOE and the BOS.

#### Background

- ▶ The Bonding Committee identified three pressing infrastructure needs:
  - ROADS 23 of 37 miles of town roads rated poor, poor/fair, fair. The town does not have a comprehensive road plan. Funding has not kept up with the deterioration of the roads.
  - ▶ ROOF REPLACEMENT
    - Town Buildings Public Safety, Ambulance, Town Hall, Senior Community Center, South End Fire House
    - ▶ School Buildings Allgrove School, Middle/High School
  - ► AIR CONDITIONING/ELECTRIC SERVICE UPGRADE at Allgrove School air condition the classrooms

### Project Scope - Roofs

- ➤ Town Roof Replacement all of the roofs listed with the exception of the South End Fire House are failing or at the end of their service life.
  - Senior Community Center original roof 1991 27 years old
  - ▶ Public Safety original roof 1991 27 years old
  - Town Hall 28 years old, failing, leaks have been patched
  - Ambulance Barn 28 years old
  - South End Fire House 16 years old, premature shingle failure.

### Project Scope - Roofs

- School Roof Replacement
  - ▶ Allgrove School 27 years old, replaced in 1992. Approaching the end of its service life. Pending State approval, it is anticipated that a 45% State Grant is available for the roof replacement project.
  - Middle/High School 27+ years old with active leaks, patching and repairs are done as needed. Pending State approval, it is anticipated that a 45% State Grant is available for the roof replacement project
  - School roofs are at end of service life not a maintenance issue. Roofs have been identified by the BOF & BOE for many years on the 5-year capital plan.
  - H.S. Gym and adjacent area's roofs are 17 years old and have 10 or more years of service life left and are not part of this project.

### Project Scope - Roads

- ▶ Pave twenty-three miles of roads rated as poor, poor/fair, fair.
  - Project would also include paving town campus parking lots
  - Project would also include a 50% town share for an anticipated State Grant to remediate riverbank scour at the Floydville Bridge
- Road Paving Assumptions for a comprehensive road maintenance program:
  - ▶ Mill and overlay 70% of the poor, poor/fair & fair town roads
  - Pulverize 15% of the poor, poor/fair & fair town roads and reuse pavement as
  - Chip Seal 15% of the town roads, stone/tar process on cross roads (similar to East Street) to extend the life-cycle of fair/good/very good roads.
  - ▶ Roads paved over a 5-year period.
  - There is not an inflation escalator built into the 5-year construction period.

#### Project Scope- Allgrove

- Electrical
  - ► Current 400 amp service
  - Upgraded service needed to handle anticipated air conditioning electrical load. Pending engineering report.
- Air conditioning
  - Initial proposal calls for a ductless system
  - ▶ 12 classrooms, 5 teaching/office spaces, 2 cafeteria
  - Does not include gym or hallways

### **Project Cost**

- Budgets have been developed by the Bonding Committee and are based on the information that the committee had at the time it issued the report.
  - ▶ If the project is approved by the Town, the Building Committee would conduct a competitive bid process by issuing Request for Proposals (RFP's) and/or utilizing the State VIP Bid List for paving.
- Roofs \$4,190,000 minus anticipated State Grant of \$1,700,000 or \$2,461,000 net to the town
  - ▶ Town Roofs \$386,000 net to town (not eligible for State Grant)
  - ▶ Allgrove \$942,000 minus \$428,000 = \$514,000 net to town
  - MS/HS \$2,862,000 minus \$1,301,000 = \$1,561,000 net to town

#### **Project Cost**

- Roads \$7,100,000
  - ▶ Road Maintenance and Paving \$6,700,000
  - ▶ Paving Town Campus estimated to be \$200,000
  - ► Floydville Bridge river bank scour remediation estimated \$150,000
- ▶ Allgrove A/C & Electric Upgrade anticipated to be \$250,000
- ► Total Appropriation \$12,200,000 (includes construction costs, bond issuance costs and the interest on Bond Anticipation Notes (BANS) payable in the first two years of the project
- Bond Issue \$9,951,000

# **Bonding Information**

- ▶ Bond Issue \$9,951,000
  - ▶ BANS (interest only) the first two years
  - Borrow only part of the overall appropriation for years one and two since roads are a five-year project
- Issue 15-year Bonds in FY22
  - Using conservative projections for interest rates since we are two years out from permanent bonds.
  - ▶ BANs Interest rates 3% and 3 ½ % we pay interest only
  - Bonds 6% interest on a decreasing scale. Does not include the net interest cost reduction paid by underwriter.

# **Bonding Information**

- Why one large project?
  - ▶ Roofs are at end of their expected life span
  - ▶ Road maintenance funding through the capital plan has not kept up with the rate of road deterioration.
  - ▶ Bonding is expensive \$140,000 estimated issuance cost
  - ▶ Future interest rate risk
  - ▶ Inflation risk
  - State Grant availability

#### **Timeline**

- Referendum February 13, 2019 at the East Granby Senior Community Center - hours to be set tonight
- If approved by the Town
  - School Roofs tight timeline for mid-June 2019 construction during summer vacation otherwise 2020.
  - ▶ Town Roofs completed by fall 2019
  - ▶ Roads 5-year period starting in Spring of 2019, parking lots fall of 2019 and scour remediation in 2020
  - ▶ Allgrove electric upgrade depends on utility scheduling. Air conditioning either 2019 or 2020 depends on electric upgrade

# We Can't Accurately Predict the Future

#### Revaluation

- In the aggregate Revaluation changes the Grand List of Taxable Property
- More personally it changes the relative portion of Property Taxes you pay
- Won't have the finalized new Grand List until early February

#### State Aid to Municipalities

- Typically 12%-14% of total Town revenue
- Expect substantial changes this year ...
- ... but no clue what they'll be

And none of this has anything to do with the project!

#### But We Can Estimate Based on our Current Taxes

#### AS AN EXAMPLE:

If this year you were liable for \$6,500 in Property Taxes
In the highest cost year the project would cost you
an additional \$400 for the year or
about \$33 a month

Expect the change to be phased in

- Part next year (2019-2020)
- Part the following year (2020-2021)
- In the full third year when bonds are sold (2021-2022)
- Small reductions in the following years until bonds are paid off
